Radio: Live on WVPO 840 AM and redzonemedia.com. Chuck Seese will handle the play-by-play with Bob Brittain doing color commentary. Pre-game begins at 1:30 p.m.

THE MATCH-UP: East Stroudsburg University hosts Bloomsburg on Senior Day at Eiler-Martin Stadium. The two squads have alternated wins since 2002, with Bloomsburg winning 45-37 at home last season following ESU's 52-39 victory in the NCAA Playoffs in 2005. The meeting will be the 72nd between the two schools, tied with West Chester for the most games ESU has played against an opponent in 80 years of varsity football.

LAST TIME OUT: Sophomore kicker **Greg Knauss** set a school record with five field goals in the Warriors' 30-15 loss at No. 14 West Chester on Saturday. Knauss was named the D2Football.com Special Teams Player of the Week on Tuesday. He connected from 45, 34, 20, 30 and 27 yards and pulled the Warriors within 14-12 on the final play of the first half. Knauss is the third player in PSAC history to make five field goals in a game. Junior QB **Tim Roken** threw for a career-high 282 yards and sophomore WR **Sam Shuman** had seven catches for 88 yards to lead the ESU offense.

MORE KNAUSS: Two ESU kickers had made four field goals in a game prior to Saturday at West Chester. Ed Detwiler, who holds the ESU and PSAC record with 50 field goals in his career, made four in a 40-13 win over California in 1992. Most recently, Matt Seagreaves connected on four field goals in a 31-14 win to open the 1994 season at Division I-AA Lafayette. Knauss is the third player in PSAC history to make five field goals in a game, joining Matt Mapes of Lock Haven (2000 vs. Slippery Rock) and Bill May of Clarion (1977 vs. IUP). Knauss is 12-of-17 for the season and has a shot at the school record of 15, which is shared by Seagreaves (1994) and Detwiler (1992).

Knauss also set the school record with a 53-yard field goal on Sept. 15 vs. IUP in the first home night game in school history. The kick came on the final play of the first half to give the Warriors a 20-17 halftime lead and broke the previous mark held by Todd McNamee, who made a 50-yard field goal vs. Southern Conn. State in 1988.

THE HEAD COACHES: **Denny Douds** (Slippery Rock '63) is in his 34th season as head football coach at ESU, and his 42nd season at ESU overall. Last season, Douds became just the 10th active college football coach to pass the 200-win plateau and enters today's game with a career record of 208-139-3. Douds has led the Warriors to nine PSAC titles and three NCAA Playoff appearances, including the Northeast Region championship in 2005 when ESU advanced to the national semifinals.

Danny Hale (West Chester '68) is in his 15th season as the head coach at Bloomsburg and his 20th season overall as a collegiate head coach. Hale has compiled a record of 122-44-1 with the Huskies and is 162-57-1 in his career. He was was 40-13 in five seasons (1984-88) as head coach at his alma mater and began his tenure at Bloomsburg in 1993. Hale has led Bloomsburg to at least a share of 10 PSAC East championships and five NCAA Division II postseason appearances.

PARTRIDGE GOES FOR 284: Junior TB **Joe Partridge** set the ESU single-game rushing record with 284 yards, and tied another record with four rushing touchdowns, in the Warriors' 42-6 win at Cheyney on Oct. 13. The previous mark was held by Andre Myers, who ran for 267 yards against Mansfield in 1998. He tied the rushing touchdown record shared by three other players - Stewart Ford (1999 vs. Glenville State), Johnny Lee Davis (1990 vs. Cheyney) and Danny Roskos (1946 vs. Montclair).

MORE PARTRIDGE: Tied Myers for fourth in ESU history with 34 carries in a game ... ran for 103 yards in the first quarter and 109 yards in the second quarter ... had 24 carries for 212 yards and four TDs at halftime ... broke the record with a 12-yard run midway through the third quarter ... had the 10th 200-yard rushing game in school history . . recorded his first career 100-yard rushing game as well . . entered the game with 237 yards and three TDs ... averaging 92.3 yards per game and 6.2 yards per carry in 2007.

TURN ON THE LIGHTS: ESU played the first home night game in school history on Sept. 15 against IUP and may also turn on the lights for Saturday's game against Bloomsburg, which features a 2 p.m. kickoff for the PSAC Game of the Week. The Warriors played their first three games this season under the lights - Aug. 27 at California (7 p.m.), Sept. 8 at Lock Haven (9 p.m.) and Sept. 15 vs. IUP (6 p.m.).

THE QUARTERBACKS: Redshirt junior **Tim Roken** has started four of the last five games at quarterback. He threw for a career-high 282 yards at West Chester last week after being held out of ESU's 42-6 win at Cheyney on Oct. 13 due to an injury. Roken is fifth in the PSAC in passing average (241.6 yards per game) and third in total offense (254.2 yards per game). He has thrown for at least 200 yards in four of his five starts:

Redshirt sophomore **Tom O'Brien** made his second career start at Cheyney, going 8-of-15 for 114 yards and two touchdowns. His first start came in the season opener at Cal, where he was 16-of-28 for 91 yards and two interceptions, and was sacked nine times. The Vulcans returned all 11 starters off the PSAC's top defense from a year ago.

THE TAILBACKS: Junior **Joe Partridge** is fifth in the PSAC with 92.3 rushing yards per game and is averaging 6.2 yards per carry on the season. He set the ESU single-game record with 284 rushing yards at Cheyney and has been ESU's leading rusher in the last five games. Partridge made his first start of the season vs. Slippery Rock and ran for 63 yards on 11 carries.

THE LAST MEETING

Bloomsburg 45, ESU 37 Nov. 4, 2006

BLOOMSBURG – East Stroudsburg University's Jimmy Terwilliger and his counterpart from Bloomsburg Dan Latorre engaged in a shootout but it was four Warriors turnovers that were the difference.

Bloomsburg got one step closer to a Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Eastern Division title with a 45-37 victory, Saturday in front of a large crowd at Robert B. Redman Stadium. Terwilliger completed 35 of 48 passes for 412 yards and five touchdowns and Latorre connected on eight of 14 passes for 213 yards and three touchdowns as the two teams combined for 772 yards of total offense.

Terwilliger threw for five touchdowns for the fifth time in his career and went over 14,000 career passing yards, the first in Division II history to reach the mark.

Freshman Sam Shuman caught 10 passes for 112 yards and a touchdown and Evan Prall caught nine passes for 122 yards and a touchdown.

ESU was within eight with less than three minutes left but Bloomsburg ran out the clock for the victory. Latorre picked up a first down on fourth-and-inches.

Partridge was the projected starter entering the season but missed the season opener due to injury. He returned against Lock Haven and ran for 95 yards and two TDs in the second half in his first action of the season. Partridge had 424 all-purpose yards (249 rushing, 165 receiving) and four TDs as the backup tailback in 2006.

Redshirt freshman **Brant Quick** started the first four games at tailback, running for 54 yards on 21 carries in his first career start at Cal, and ran 22 times for 115 yards and a touchdown the following week at Lock Haven. He carried seven times for 62 yards in the second half against Cheyney.

THE WIDE RECEIVERS: Redshirt sophomore **Sam Shuman** caught seven passes for 88 yards at West Chester and leads the Warriors with 25 catches, 362 yards and three TDs this season. He also gained 88 yards on three catches, including two TDs, vs. IUP and had five catches for a season-high 92 yards vs. Slippery Rock. Shuman is averaging 14.5 yards per catch in 2007 and averaged 15.2 yards per catch as a freshman (31 catches, 472 yards).

Freshman **Jon Clouse** had the first four catches of his career for 76 yards and two TDs (15 and 29 yards) to lead ESU at Cheyney. Clouse has started the last three games after being held out of the first four as a potential redshirt. He has seven catches for 126 yards (18.0 avg.) on the season.

Redshirt junior **Doug Ogden** has 20 catches for 237 yards and two TDs this year. He was ESU's leading returning receiver entering the year (39 catches, 494 yards, six TDs). He has 71 catches for 856 yards and nine TDs in his career at ESU.

Redshirt freshman **Jeff Giglio** leads ESU with a 20.4 yards per catch average (seven catches, 143 yards) and has two plays of at least 50 yards this season - a 51-yard TD on his first career catch at Lock Haven, and had a 53-yard catch against Slippery Rock.

Junior **Drew Stem** leads ESU with 21 catches but is expected to miss the remainder of the season with a broken arm which he suffered against Slippery Rock. Stem is fourth in the PSAC with 143.2 all-purpose yards per game. He had at least 100 all-purpose yards in his last three games - 119 vs. Slippery Rock, 268 vs. Millersville and 169 vs. IUP. His kick return average of 30.9 ranks second in ESU history, and he will hold the career record with a 29.9-yard average entering his senior season.

THE OFFENSIVE LINE: Sr. LT **Mike Habel**, a four-year starter and first team All-PSAC East selection, has started 41 games in his career and is the leader of the offensive line.

Sr. G **Thomas Sugden**, Sr. C **Michael Parshley** and So. G/T **Morgan Thomas** have also started all seven games on the offensive line. R-So. **Matt Keller** has started five games at right tackle and Jr. Anthony Glover has started two games at guard for ESU. (For a complete game-by-game look at the offensive line, see the graphic below).

THE LINEBACKERS: ESU returned all four starters at linebacker from 2006 in outside linebackers R-Jr. **Steve Van Alstine** and R-Jr. **David Pacchioni**, and inside linebackers Sr. **Jayson Frank** and Sr. **Dave Lotier**. Jr. **Fred Rice** led ESU with 132 tackles as a freshman in 2005 and missed all but three games in 2006 to receive a medical redshirt.

All four of the starting linebackers have an interception through the first seven games - Frank vs. Millersville and Slippery Rock, Van Alstine vs. IUP, and Lotier and Pacchioni at Lock Haven.

Frank, a first team All-PSAC East selection in 2006, is tied for second in the PSAC with 9.6 tackles per game (67 tackles). He also leads the Warriors with 3.0 sacks and two interceptions. He has eight or more tackles in six games, and three games with at least 10 - 11 at West Chester, 12 vs. IUP and 14 vs. Millersville (2.5 TFL, sack). Frank had eight tackles and a sack in each of the first two games, and led ESU with 86 tackles last season.

EAST STROUDSBURG UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

Lotier is second on the team and 10th in the PSAC with 60 tackles. He led ESU with 13 tackles vs. IUP and has six career interceptions in 21 starts. He returned a pick 42 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter at Lock Haven.

Pacchioni was a member of the All-PSAC East second team in 2006 and has 38 tackles, a sack and an interception this year after recording 47 tackles and four sacks last season. He had a team-high 12 tackles vs. Slippery Rock and also broke up two passes.

Van Alstine has 42 tackles and 2.5 tackles for a loss this season. He returned an interception 71 yards to set up the Warriors' first touchdown against IUP.

Rice has seen limited action through the first seven games, playing primarily on special teams. He has 22 tackles this season, including seven stops at Lock Haven. He has been used as a defensive end in pass rushing situations in the last two games, along with R-Fr. OLB **Matt Freed**. Rice also returned seven kicks for 85 yards in the last three weeks.

THE DEFENSIVE LINE: The ESU defensive line has three new starters from a year ago, with Jr. DT **Miguel Rivera** (14 tackles, sack) as the only holdover. R-Jr. DE **Dave Iobst** leads the defensive line with 32 tackles and 7.0 TFL. R-So. **Matthew Faas** leads the defensive line with 2.5 sacks and has 19 tackles and 4.5 TFL. R-Jr. DT **Jeff Shrive** (20 tackles) has also started all seven games in 2007. Jr. DE **Ray Ramirez** has 24 tackles and 3.5 TFL and R-Fr. DE **Jeff Case** had his first two career sacks at Cheyney.

THE SECONDARY: Seven different players have started games at the three spots in the ESU secondary this season. Fr. CB **David Castillo** has started the last three games, with Jr. CB **Scott Christy** starting on the other side in the last two games. So. **Nick Artinger** has four starts and Sr. CB **Mike Gowen** started the first three games before suffering an injury against IUP. R-Fr. CB **Rob Hartenfels** has the other start at corner for the Warriors this season. Jr. FS **Mike Gnall** has made five starts at safety, while Fr. FS **Kevin Schafer** has the other two. Schafer and Artinger are the primary nickel backs in passing situations.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Sophomore kicker **Greg Knauss** has set the ESU single-game record with five field goals (Oct. 20 at West Chester), and the school record for the longest field goal with a 53-yard kick (Sept. 15 vs. IUP). He is second in Division II with 1.7 field goals per game this season and is 12-of-17 on the year. Knauss is approaching the school record of 15 field goals in a season which is shared by Ed Detwiler (1992) and Matt Seagreaves (1994). He has made four field goals of 40 yards or more this season.

In the punting game, junior **Nick Krut** is third in the PSAC with a 40.8 yard average, including a career-long 60-yard punt vs. Slippery Rock and a 59-yarder last week at West Chester. ESU has a net punting average of 37.9 yards this season and was third in Division II in net punting last year (36.0). Senior LB **Brock Williard** is in his fourth year as the long snapper.

The Warriors' kick blocking unit has also excelled, as ESU has blocked five of its opponents 25 extra-point attempts this season. **Dave Lotier** has two blocks (at Cal, vs. Slippery Rock), along with **Fred Rice** (at Cal), **David Pacchioni** (at Cheyney) and **Ray Ramirez** (at West Chester).

WARRIORS ON TV: All four of the Warriors' home games will be broadcast on Blue Ridge TV 13, the 20th season that Blue Ridge will broadcast ESU football. Chris Doty handles play-by-play and Blue Ridge Sports Director Bob Capasso is the color commentator. Additionally, today's game is being broadcast across the state on PA SPORTSfever TV, which is airing a PSAC Game of the Week during each week of the 2007 season. The broadcast outlets in the Poconos are WQMY-53 (channel 16 on Blue Ridge Cable) and WSWB-38 (channel 11 on Blue Ridge).

WARRIORS ON RADIO: WVPO 840 AM has broadcast ESU football for 45 years, with Chuck Seese and Bob Brittain forming the broadcast team once again in 2007. WESS 90.3 FM, ESU's campus radio station, will also broadcast selected games.

TERWILLIGER AND PRALL: QB Jimmy Terwilliger, the 2005 Harlon Hill Award recipient as the most outstanding player in Division II, started all 48 games in his career at ESU before graduating last May. Terwilliger left with 15 ESU and 14 NCAA records, including tying the NCAA all-division record with 148 touchdown passes. He also set Division II standards for passing yards (14,350) and total offense (16,064). Terwilliger was a three-time recipient of the PSAC East Offensive Player of the Year (2003, 2004 and 2006), and set PSAC records with 4,571 passing yards, 4,960 yards of total offense and 50 passing touchdowns as ESU won the Northeast Region championship in 2005.

WR Evan Prall set PSAC records with 4,093 receiving yards and 50 touchdowns in his career at ESU from 2003-06. He teamed with Terwilliger for 164 catches, 2,940 yards and 40 touchdowns over his final two seasons and also holds ESU's all-purpose yardage record with 5,682 all-purpose yards when adding in more than 1,000 yards as a kick returner and 500 yards as a punt returner. Prall made it to the final cut with the New York Jets before being released following their final preseason game.

Denny Douds enters his 34th season as the head football coach at East Stroudsburg University as one of three active coaches in NCAA Division II, and one of just 10 coaches in all of college football, with at least 200 career victories.

Douds notched the 200th win of his illustrious career last season when the Warriors defeated Lock Haven 45-14 on Sept. 9 at Eiler-Martin Stadium. The milestone victory launched Douds into some elite company that includes Bobby Bowden and Joe Paterno as one of the handful of active coaches with 200 wins. He begins the 2007 season with 206 career victories.

The Warriors finished the 2006 campaign with a 7-4 record for their seventh straight winning season, the longest such streak of Douds' career. ESU put together six consecutive winning seasons from 1975-1980 after going 5-5 in Douds' first season at the helm of the program in 1974. Douds has sported a winning record as a head coach ever since.

ESU made its second and third appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 2004 and 2005, joining the 1991 squad which also advanced to the postseason. In 2005, the Warriors won three straight playoff games to claim the Northeast Region championship before bowing out in the national semifinals. ESU's 11-3 record set a school record for wins in a single season.

A native of Indiana, Pa., Douds was a high school coach in Erie, Pa. for two years and an assistant coach at West Virginia University for one year before accepting an assistant coach position at ESU.

He started as the Warriors' tight ends and linebackers coach under head coach Charlie Reese, and then became the team's defensive coordinator in 1968. After eight seasons assisting Reese, Douds took over as the school's eighth head football coach in 1974.

Under Douds' direction, the Warriors have captured nine PSAC Eastern Division titles with solo first-place finishes in 1975, 1976, 1978, 1982, 1983 and 1991 and ties for the top spot in 1980, 2002 and 2003.

Before the PSAC championship game was eliminated in 1987, the Warriors won overall conference crowns in 1975, 1978 and 1982 and tied for the title with Shippensburg in 1976.

COACHING STAFF NOTES: The 2007 ESU coaching staff has 268 years of combined coaching experience at all levels of football (high school, college and professional). Head coach Denny Douds is in his 45th year of coaching, and 42nd at ESU. He was inducted into the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998. Assistant coaches Mike Terwilliger (1994) and Frank Lupin (2002), both ESU graduates, are also members of the Hall of Fame. Terwilliger is in his 30th season as a football coach, all at ESU, while Lupin is in his 47th year in coaching and 26th at ESU.

Defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator Kenny Stills and outside linebackers coach Joey Smith both have playing experience in the NFL. Stills was a starter in the secondary for the Green Bay Packers and the Minnesota Vikings in an NFL career that spanned from 1986-91, and Smith was a wide receiver and defensive back for the New York Giants from 1991-94.

The ESU staff also has two members that were on two of the greatest Penn State teams of the last 25 years. Rob Mikulski was a letterwinner on the Nittany Lions' national championship team in 1986, while Mike Bender was on the scout team in 1994 when Penn State went undefeated and won the Rose Bowl.

GAME 1

Aug. 27 - Cal 26, ESU 3

CALIFORNIA – No. 21-ranked California held East Stroudsburg University to 53 yards of total offense and minus-38 yards on the ground to post a 26-3 victory in the season opener for both schools at Adamson Stadium.

The Vulcans, who returned all 11 starters off a unit that led the PSAC in scoring defense in 2006, had nine sacks and two interceptions of ESU redshirt sophomore quarterback **Tom O'Brien**, who was making his first career start.

The first set up Cal's first touchdown, an 11-yard pass from Joe Ruggiero from Nate Forse on the first offensive play to give the Vulcans a 6-0 lead with 13:20 to go in the first quarter. Senior linebacker **Dave Lotier** blocked the extra point.

The second interception effectively sealed the win, as linebacker Gary Butler deflected a pass which fell into the hands of defensive lineman Mark Malloy, who returned the ball 20 yards for a touchdown and a 20-3 lead.

The first half was a defensive stalemate, with the Warriors holding Cal to 83 yards of offense, and ESU got on the board with a 24-yard field goal by **Greg Knauss** on the final play of the half. **Mike Gowen** had ESU's second interception of the half with 2:24 left in the second quarter to set the offense up at the 33-yard line. **Mike Gnal** also intercepted Ruggiero to stall a drive in the first quarter.

Cal's first possession of the second half stalled at the 31 before the Vulcans put together their first sustained drive of the game, marching 73 yards on 12 plays. A 31-yard pass to Forse on fourth-and-seven gave Cal a first-and-goal at the two, and Brandon Lombardy scored on a one-yard run to give Cal a 13-3 lead with 7:38 left in the third quarter. Malloy's interception return for a touchdown came with 14:06 left in the fourth quarter, and Ruggiero hit Joe Slappy for a 15-yard touchdown pass to give Cal a 26-3 lead with just over four minutes remaining. **Fred Rice** blocked the PAT for the Warriors.

Redshirt freshman tailback **Brant Quick** had 54 yards on 21 carries for ESU, while O'Brien was 16-of-28 for 91 yards passing. **Sam Shuman** was the leading receiver with four catches for 38 yards.

Ruggiero, a two-time first team All-PSAC West selection at quarterback, was 15-for-25 passing for 155 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. The Warriors limited Lombardy to 95 yards on 24 carries and held the Vulcans to 244 yards of total offense for the game.

Sept. 8 - ESU 58, LHU 13

LOCK HAVEN – Junior quarterback **Tim Roken** threw for 260 yards and four touchdowns, and tailbacks **Brant Quick** and **Joe Partridge** combined for 210 yards and three scores to lead East Stroudsburg University to a 58-13 win at Lock Haven.

Roken threw a pair of 50-yard touchdown passes in his first career start, hitting **Drew Stem** with a 51-yard bomb in the first quarter and **Jeff Giglio** for a 52-yard score in the second quarter.

Quick earned his second straight start and carried 22 times for 115 yards. He opened the scoring with a six-yard run and rolled up 102 yards in the first half. Partridge took over midway through the third quarter and ran 11 times for 95 yards in his first action of the season and scored on runs of one and 25 yards.

Greg Knauss missed the PAT but hit a 20-yard field goal on the next possession to make the score 23-7. Lock Haven followed with a three-yard touchdown run by Ibrahim Smith to cut the lead to 23-13.

Giglio's first career catch and touchdown made the halftime score 30-13, and the Warriors scored four second half touchdowns to pull away. ESU finished the game scoring the final 35 points.

Dave Lotier had an interception and 42-yard return for a touchdown midway through the third quarter to extend the lead to 44-13, and Roken finished the scoring with an 11-yard touchdown pass to **Doug Ogden**.

Ogden was the Warriors leading receiver with five catches for 52 yards and a touchdown, while Chris Hawkins caught seven passes for 82 yards for Lock Haven. The Bald Eagles threw four interceptions, two each by DiPaolo and Jason Eby.

GAME 3

Sept. 15 - IUP 38, ESU 23

EAST STROUDSBURG - IUP scored the final 21 points of the game to beat East Stroudsburg University 38-23 in the first night football game in Eiler-Martin Stadium history.

ESU went ahead 23-17 on a 37-yard field goal by sophomore **Greg Knauss** with 14:08 left in the game, but the Crimson Hawks put together a 62-yard drive to take the lead for good. Andrew Krewatch hit Anthony Rodriguez for a 21-yard touchdown that capped the drive, and the extra point by Craig Burgess gave IUP a 24-23 edge.

Kareem Dutrieuille scored on a 25-yard run with 3:19 remaining to put IUP ahead 31-23, and Terrence Jackson returned a fumble 49 yards for a touchdown to put the game away less than a minute later.

Knauss made a school-record 53-yard field goal at the end of the first half to give ESU a 20-17 advantage at the break, and made three field goals in the game.

The Warriors opened the scoring with a seven-yard touchdown pass from **Tim Roken** to **Sam Shuman** that was set up by a 71-yard interception return by **Steve Van Alstine**, who picked off a pass at the three-yard line to thwart IUP's first drive of the game.

IUP answered with two touchdowns, on a seven-yard run by Poohbear McNeal and a six-yard pass from Krewatch to Dan Pickens, to take a 14-7 lead in the second quarter.

Knauss and Matt McNelis traded field goals to maintain the Crimson Hawks' seven-point edge before Roken hooked up with Shuman for a 65-yard touchdown, their second of the first half, to level the score at 17-17 with 5:41 remaining. Knauss drilled his 53-yard field goal at the gun to give ESU a three-point lead at halftime.

IUP outgained ESU 414-306 for the game and held a 170-32 advantage in rushing yards, led by McNeal (21-103) and Dutrieuille (16-76). Krewatch was 16-for-32 for 244 yards and two touchdowns. Ken Witter (four catches, 82 yards) and Mychal Skinner (two catches, 62 yards) were the top targets.

Roken was 18-for-39 for 259 yards through the air for ESU and also caught a 15-yard pass from tailback Brant Quick. Drew Stem (6-51), Doug Ogden (4-78) and Shuman (3-88, 2 TD) were the top receivers for the Warriors.

Senior inside linebackers **Dave Lotier** and **Jayson Frank** made 13 and 12 tackles, respectively, to lead the ESU defense.

Sept. 29 - Mville 36, ESU 24

EAST STROUDSBURG - Freshman quarterback Jamal Smith ran for 136 yards and threw for 157 yards and two touchdowns to lead Millersville to a 36-24 win in the PSAC East opener for both schools.

Smith led a Millersville offense that failed to produce a touchdown in its first four games but struck for a pair of first quarter scores, on three-yard runs by Cardoza Jacks and Brad Lantz. Smith completed only 5-of-12 passes for the day but found Jimmie Cotton for a 36-yard score with 6:25 left in the half to take a 20-0 advantage.

Sandwiched between the scores was a 40-yard kick return for a touchdown by Millersville tailback Brad Lantz, who picked up the ESU onside kick attempt to put the Marauders ahead 36-17 with 3:19 left.

Junior wide receiver **Drew Stem** led ESU offensively with eight catches for 60 yards, returned six kickoffs for 181 yards and two punts for 27 yards for 268 all-purpose yards in the game.

Buck and Brandon Shelton had a hand in all four ESU turnovers, as Buck recovered two first-quarter fumbles, one which was forced by Shelton. Shelton also ended the Warriors' first drive with an interception deep in Millersville territory.

EAST STROUDSBURG - Ryan Lehmeier ran for 27 times for 229 yards and two touchdowns and Damarcus Cleckley added 109 yards and a score on 19 carries to lead Slippery Rock to a 31-24 win at East Stroudsburg University on Homecoming at Eiler-Martin Stadium.

Slippery Rock (5-1) ran for 332 yards, threw for 220 and held the ball for more than 39 minutes in the contest.

Tim Roken threw for 236 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another, and **Sam Shuman** caught five passes for 93 yards to lead the ESU offense.

Slippery Rock got on the board with 6:04 left in the first quarter on an 18-yard field goal by C.J. Bahr. Lehmeier put the Rock back in front with a 47-yard touchdown run on the first drive of the second half, and Cleckley scored from one yard out on the final play of the period.

ESU went 75 yards to pull within 31-24 with 10 minutes left, with **Joe Partridge** breaking runs of 14 and 20 yards and Roken doing the rest with his arm, including a seven-yard touchdown pass to **Doug Ogden**.

GAME 6

Oct. 13 - ESU 42, Cheyney 6

CHEYNEY - Junior **Joe Partridge** ran for 284 yards to set a school record and scored four touchdowns to tie another, and East Stroudsburg University set the Division II record for consecutive wins over one opponent with a 42-6 victory at Cheyney.

Partridge carried 34 times for 284 yards to break the single-game rushing record of 267 yards, which was set by Andre Myers against Mansfield in 1998. He ran for four touchdowns, all in the first half, to tie the record shared by three other players.

ESU won its 28th straight game against Cheyney, setting the Division II record that was shared with Minn.-Duluth, who won 27 straight over Wisc.-Superior from 1962-89. The Warriors own the all-time series 51-1.

Partridge ran for 103 yards on 12 carries in the first quarter, and 109 yards on 12 carries in the second quarter. He started his day with runs of 17 and 23 yards on the Warriors' first two snaps, and scored from three yards out to give ESU a 7-0 lead with 12:23 left in the opening period.

He added a two-yard touchdown with 1:58 left in the first quarter, and scored on a 34-yard run two minutes into the second quarter.

Cheyney scored its only touchdown on a one-yard run by quarterback Derrick Murry to complete an 11-play, 46-yard drive.

Partridge carried the ball on the first eight plays of ESU's ensuing possession, gaining 57 yards, and scored his fourth touchdown of the game on fourth-and-goal from the two to put the Warriors ahead 28-6. **David Castillo** had his first career interception on the final play of the half to preserve the lead.

Quarterback **Tom O'Brien**, making his second career start, hooked up with freshman **Jon Clouse** for the only scoring of the second half, finding Clouse for a 15-yard touchdown in the third quarter and a 29-yard score early in the fourth. O'Brien was 8-of-15 for 114 yards and Clouse had the first four catches of his career for 76 yards.

Partridge set the record with a 12-yard run midway through the third quarter and carried one more time, for five yards, before being leaving the game for redshirt freshman Brant Quick. Quick ran seven times for 62 yards in the contest, and ESU accumulated 337 yards rushing on 45 carries in the game.

Murry entered the game averaging 254.0 yards passing but was limited to a 6-of-18 day for 65 yards before he left in the fourth quarter. Cheyney had 219 yards of total offense and 114 yards passing. Billy Mitchell ran for 102 yards on 21 carries for the Wolves.

WEST CHESTER - Bill Zwaan threw for 243 yards and three touchdowns to lead West Chester to a 30-15 win over East Stroudsburg University at Farrell Stadium.

Greg Knauss did all of the scoring for the Warriors, making five field goals to set a school record. Knauss made four field goals in the first half, including a 30-yard kick on the final play of the half to pull ESU within 14-12 at halftime.

Tim Roken was 22-for-44 for 282 yards and **Sam Shuman** had seven catches for 88 yards for ESU.

West Chester improved to 7-1 and clinched at least a share of the PSAC East championship with a 4-0 record. ESU falls to 2-5 on the season and 1-2 in the conference.

Mike Washington (4 catches, 168 yards) caught a 62-yard touchdown pass from Zwaan on the first play from scrimmage to give West Chester a 7-0 lead 17 seconds into the game. Knauss made a 45-yard field goal to finish ESU's first possession, a 34-yard kick to make the score 7-6 midway through the first quarter, and a 20-yard kick on the first play of the second quarter to put the Warriors ahead 9-7.

Zwaan hit Cody Clark for an 11-yard score to give the Golden Rams a 14-9 lead with 5:12 left in the half before Knauss tied the school record with his fourth field goal of the game on the play of the half.

A 20-yard touchdown pass from Zwaan to Steve Miller extended the lead to 21-12 and was the only scoring of the third quarter.

Knauss made a 27-yard field goal to bring ESU within 21-15 early in the final period, but the Golden Rams responded with a kickoff return to midfield and Lee Hopkins scored on a 48-yard run on the next play. The extra point was blocked to make the score 27-15, and Alex Walsh added a 33-yard field goal with 5:13 left to set the final margin.

West Chester ran for 222 yards, led by Hopkins (11-90) and Dean Millard (12-77). The Golden Rams defense limited the Warriors to 71 yards of total offense in the second half and sacked Roken five times.
