**THE MATCH-UP:** East Stroudsburg University takes its PSAC East championship aspirations to West Chester in a critical conference match-up for the Warriors. A victory would hand the Golden Rams their first PSAC East loss of the season and put ESU in position to claim at least a share of the championship with wins in its final two games.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Junior tailback **Joe Partridge** set the ESU single-game rushing record with 284 yards, and tied another record with four touchdowns, in the Warriors' 42-6 win at Cheyney on Saturday. The victory was ESU's 28th straight over Cheyney, setting the Division II record for consecutive wins over one opponent. Redshirt sophomore quarterback **Tom O'Brien**, making his second career start, threw the first two touchdown passes of his career to freshman wide receiver **Jon Clouse**.

**MORE PARTRIDGE:** Broke the school record previously held by Andre Myers (267 yards vs. Mansfield, 1998) . . . tied rushing touchdown record with four TDs, shared by Stewart Ford (1999 vs. Glenville State), Johnny Lee Davis (1990 vs. Cheyney) and Danny Roskos (1946 vs. Montclair) . . . tied Myers for fourth in ESU history with 34 carries in a game . . . ran for 103 yards in the first quarter and 109 yards in the second quarter ... had 24 carries for 212 yards and four TDs at halftime ... broke the record with a 12-yard run midway through the third quarter ... became the 10th Warrior to run for more than 200 yards in a game . . . recorded his first career 100-yard rushing game as well . . . entered the game with 237 yards and three TDs in 2007 . . . averaging 6.7 yards per carry and 104.2 yards per game.

**THE HEAD COACHES:** **Denny Douds** (Slippery Rock '63) is in his 34th season as head football coach at ESU, and his 42nd season at ESU overall. Last season, Douds became just the 10th active college football coach to pass the 200-win plateau and enters today's game with a career record of 208-138-3. Douds has led the Warriors to nine PSAC titles and three NCAA Playoff appearances, including the Northeast Region championship in 2005 when ESU advanced to the national semifinals.

Bill Zwaan (Delaware '79) is in his fifth season as head coach at West Chester and has a record of 42-18 at WCU, and 96-39 overall. He has guided the Golden Rams to three straight NCAA Division II playoff appearances, including the school's first-ever national semifinal berth in 2004. He was also head coach at Widener for six seasons, going 54-21.

**TURN ON THE LIGHTS:** Tonight's game is ESU's fourth night game of the season. The Warriors played each of their first three games under the lights, including the first home night game in school history on Sept. 15 against IUP. The lights will also be on at Eiler-Martin Stadium on Oct. 27 for a 2 p.m. game vs. Bloomsburg that will be featured as the PSAC Game of the Week as part of the conference's television package with PA SPORTSfever.

**RETURNING ALL-PSAC PLAYERS:** The Warriors return three players who earned All-PSAC East honors in 2006, including one first-teamer on both sides of the ball. On offense, senior LT **Mike Habel** entered the season with 34 starts on the offensive line in his career at ESU. Senior LB **Jayson Frank** (1st team) and junior OLB **David Pacchioni** (2nd team) lead a group of five experienced linebackers. Frank had a team-leading 86 tackles last season, and Pacchioni made 47 tackles with four sacks.

**WHO'S GONE:** Five ESU seniors were named All-PSAC East last season. QB Jimmy Terwilliger, WR Evan Prall and DE Greg Thoman were on the first team, and TB Matt Brunetti and DT Andrew Marsteller were on the second team.

ESU lost 10 starters in all off last year's team. WR Wes Lindsay and RG David Biever were also starters on offense, while DE John Vetter, CB Mike Macksoud and S Michael Wiggins were members of the defense. K Eric Petters is also no longer on the team.

**SCHOOL RECORD FOR KNAUSS:** Sophomore kicker **Greg Knauss** broke ESU's 19-year old school record with a 53-yard field goal on the final play of the first half against IUP on Sept. 15. The previous record was held by Todd McNamee, who made a 50-yard field goal vs. Southern Connecticut State in 1988.

**THE QUARTERBACKS:** Redshirt sophomore **Tom O'Brien** made his second career start at Cheyney, going 8-of-15 for 114 yards and two touchdowns. His first start came in the season opener at Cal, where he was 16-of-28 for 91 yards and two interceptions, and was sacked nine times. The Vulcans returned all 11 starters off the PSAC's top defense from a year ago.

Redshirt junior **Tim Roken** had started the previous four games for ESU before being held out of the Cheyney game due to injury. Roken is fourth in the PSAC and second among PSAC East quarterbacks with 249.2 yards of total offense per game. He had 265 yards of total offense vs. Slippery Rock (236 passing, 29 rushing) and has thrown for at least 200 yards in three of his four starts. He is averaging 231.5 yards passing per game with nine touchdowns and just four interceptions, and also ran for a touchdown in each of his last two starts. His best outing came at Lock Haven, where he threw for 260 yards and four touchdowns.

**THE TAILBACKS:** Junior **Joe Partridge** is coming off a record-setting game at Cheyney, where he broke the school record with 284 rushing yards and tied a record with four rushing touchdowns. He has been ESU's leading rusher in the last four games. Partridge made his first start of the season vs. Slippery Rock and ran for 63 yards on 11 carries. He is averaging 104.2 yards per game and 6.7 yards per carry, and has scored seven TDs this season.

Partridge was the projected starter entering the season but missed the season opener due to injury. He returned against Lock Haven and ran for 95 yards and two TDs in the second half in his first action of the season. Partridge had 424 all-purpose yards (249 rushing, 165 receiving) and four TDs as the backup tailback in 2006.

Redshirt freshman **Brant Quick** started the first four games at tailback, running for 54 yards on 21 carries in his first career start at Cal, and ran 22 times for 115 yards and a touchdown the following week at Lock Haven. He carried seven times for 62 yards in the second half against Cheyney.

## THE LAST MEETING

### West Chester 49, ESU 28

Oct. 28, 2006

EAST STROUDSBURG – Tailback Brent Steinmetz rushed for a season-high 161 yards and quarterback Bill Zwaan threw for four touchdowns to help West Chester beat East Stroudsburg University 49-28, Saturday in a Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Eastern Division game at Eiler-Martin Stadium.

Steinmetz carried 32 times and rushed for one touchdown as West Chester improved to 6-3 overall and 4-1 in the PSAC East. Zwaan completed 17 of 21 passes for 213 yards and no interceptions.

ESU, which turned the ball over four times, fell to 6-3 overall and 3-1 in conference play.

West Chester jumped out to a 35-7 lead at halftime and held a 39:50-20:10 advantage in time of possession. Zwaan threw for touchdowns of 6, 20, 19 and 29 yards and Steinmetz rushed for a 20-yard score to help the Golden Rams win their fourth straight against ESU.

Sophomore wide out Mike Washington had three touchdowns and finished with six catches for 137 yards. He now has 2,058 receiving yards, 10th best all-time at West Chester.

ESU quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger completed 20 of 36 passes for 249 yards and three touchdowns and rushed nine times for 136 yards. He now has 15,297 yards of career total offense and became the first player in NCAA Division II history to go over the milestone. Timmy Chang of Division I Hawaii and Steve McNair of Division I-AA Alcorn State have also surpassed 15,000 yards.

**THE WIDE RECEIVERS:** Freshman **Jon Clouse** had the first four catches of his career for 76 yards and two TDs (15 and 29 yards) to lead ESU at Cheyney. Clouse has started the last two games after being held out of the first four as a potential redshirt.

Redshirt sophomore **Sam Shuman** had five catches for 93 yards against Slippery Rock and leads the Warriors with 274 receiving yards on 18 catches this season. He has also scored three TDs, including three catches for 88 yards and two TDs vs. IUP in the home opener. Shuman is averaging 16.1 yards per catch this season and averaged 15.2 yards per catch as a freshman (31 catches, 472 yards).

Senior **Doug Ogden** has 17 catches for 206 yards and two TDs this year, and caught three passes for 34 yards and a touchdown vs. Slippery Rock. He was ESU's leading returning receiver entering the year, with 39 catches for 494 yards and six touchdowns in 2006. He has 68 catches for 825 yards and nine TDs in his career at ESU.

Redshirt freshman **Jeff Giglio** leads ESU with a 21.7 yards per catch average (six catches, 130 yards) and has two plays of at least 50 yards this season - a 51-yard TD on his first career catch at Lock Haven, and had a 53-yard catch against Slippery Rock.

Junior **Drew Stem** leads ESU with 21 catches but is expected to miss the remainder of the season with a broken arm which he suffered against Slippery Rock. Stem is fourth in the PSAC with 143.2 all-purpose yards per game. He had at least 100 all-purpose yards in his last three games - 119 vs. Slippery Rock, 268 vs. Millersville and 169 vs. IUP. His kick return average of 30.9 ranks second in ESU history, and he will hold the career record with a 29.9-yard average entering his senior season.

**THE OFFENSIVE LINE:** Sr. LT **Mike Habel**, a four-year starter and first team All-PSAC East selection, has started 40 games in his career and is the leader of the offensive line. The Warriors reshuffled their line after giving up nine sacks at Cal and have given up just eight sacks over the last five games.

Sr. G **Thomas Sugden**, Sr. C **Michael Parshley** and So. G/T **Morgan Thomas** have also started all six games on the offensive line. R-So. **Matt Keller** has started four games at right tackle and Jr. Anthony Glover has started two games at guard for ESU. (For a complete game-by-game look at the offensive line, see the graphic below).

**THE LINEBACKERS:** ESU returned all four starters at linebacker from 2006 in outside linebackers Jr. **Steve Van Alstine** and Jr. **David Pacchioni**, and inside linebackers Sr. **Jayson Frank** and Sr. **Dave Lotier**. Jr. **Fred Rice** led ESU with 132 tackles as a freshman in 2005 and missed all but three games in 2006 to receive a medical redshirt.

All four of the starting linebackers have an interception through the first six games - Frank vs. Millersville and Slippery Rock, Van Alstine vs. IUP, and Lotier and Pacchioni at Lock Haven.

Frank, a first team All-PSAC East selection in 2006, leads ESU with 56 tackles and had eight tackles and his second interception of the season vs. Slippery Rock. He had 14 tackles (2.5 TFL), a sack and an interception against Millersville, made 12 tackles against IUP, and had eight tackles and a sack in both of the first two games. Frank led ESU with 86 tackles last season.

Lotier is second on the team with 53 tackles and has 2.0 sacks. He led ESU with 13 tackles vs. IUP and has six career interceptions in 20 starts. He returned a pick 42 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter at Lock Haven.

Pacchioni was a member of the All-PSAC East second team in 2006 and has 33 tackles, a sack and an interception this year after recording 47 tackles and four sacks last season. He had a team-high 12 tackles vs. Slippery Rock and also broke up two passes.

Van Alstine has 39 tackles this season (10 vs. Slippery Rock) and 2.5 tackles for a loss. He returned an interception 71 yards to set up the Warriors' first touchdown against IUP.

## EAST STROUDSBURG UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

Rice has seen limited action through the first six games, playing primarily on special teams. He has 19 tackles this season, including seven stops at Lock Haven.

**THE DEFENSIVE LINE:** The ESU defensive line has three new starters from a year ago, with Jr. DT **Miguel Rivera** (14 tackles, sack) as the only holdover. R-Jr. DE **Dave Iobst** leads the defensive line with 26 tackles and 5.5 TFL. R-So. **Matthew Faas** leads the defensive line with 2.5 sacks and has 18 tackles and 4.5 TFL. R-Jr. DT **Jeff Shrive** (18 tackles) has also started all six games in 2007. Jr. DE **Ray Ramirez** has 21 tackles and R-Fr. DE **Jeff Case** had his first two career sacks last week at Cheyney.

**THE SECONDARY:** Fr. CB **David Castillo** has started the last two games and had his first career interception on the final play of the first half at Cheyney. Fr. FS **Kevin Schafer** also made his second career start and shared time with So. FS **Mike Gnall**, who started the first four games of the season. Jr. CB **Scott Christy** made his second start of the season as well. So. CB **Nick Artinger** has made four starts and Sr. CB **Mike Gowen** started the first three games before suffering an injury against IUP.

**SPECIAL TEAMS:** Sophomore kicker **Greg Knauss** leads the PSAC with 1.17 field goals per game this season. He is 7-of-12 on field goals and had made a kick of more than 40 yards in three straight games before missing his only attempt (37 yards) at Cheyney. Knauss set the ESU school record with a 53-yard field goal on the final play of the first half against IUP, and made three field goals in the game.

In the punting game, junior **Nick Krut** is averaging 39.9 yards per punt, including a career-long 60-yard punt against Slippery Rock. ESU has a net punting average of 36.5 yards and was third in Division II in net punting last year (36.0). Senior LB **Brock Williard** is in his fourth year as the long snapper.

The Warriors' kick blocking unit has also excelled, as ESU has blocked four of its opponents 21 extra-point attempts this season. **Dave Lotier** has two blocks (at Cal, vs. Slippery Rock), along with **Fred Rice** (at Cal) and **David Pacchioni** (at Cheyney).

**WARRIORS ON TV:** All four of the Warriors' home games will be broadcast on Blue Ridge TV 13, the 20th season that Blue Ridge will broadcast ESU football. Chris Doty handles play-by-play and Blue Ridge Sports Director Bob Capasso is the color commentator. Additionally, the Oct. 27 match-up with Bloomsburg is the PSAC Game of the Week on PA SPORTSfever TV, which will be broadcasting a PSAC game across the state each week during the 2007 season. The broadcast outlets in the Poconos are WQMY-53 (channel 16 on Blue Ridge Cable) and WSWB-38 (channel 11 on Blue Ridge).

**WARRIORS ON RADIO:** WVPO 840 AM has broadcast ESU football for 45 years, with Chuck Seese and Bob Brittain forming the broadcast team once again in 2007. WESS 90.3 FM, ESU's campus radio station, will also broadcast selected games.

**TERWILLIGER AND PRALL:** QB Jimmy Terwilliger, the 2005 Harlon Hill Award recipient as the most outstanding player in Division II, started all 48 games in his career at ESU before graduating last May. Terwilliger left with 15 ESU and 14 NCAA records, including tying the NCAA all-division record with 148 touchdown passes. He also set Division II standards for passing yards (14,350) and total offense (16,064). Terwilliger was a three-time recipient of the PSAC East Offensive Player of the Year (2003, 2004 and 2006), and set PSAC records with 4,571 passing yards, 4,960 yards of total offense and 50 passing touchdowns as ESU won the Northeast Region championship in 2005.

WR Evan Prall set PSAC records with 4,093 receiving yards and 50 touchdowns in his career at ESU from 2003-06. He teamed with Terwilliger for 164 catches, 2,940 yards and 40 touchdowns over his final two seasons and also holds ESU's all-purpose yardage record with 5,682 all-purpose yards when adding in more than 1,000 yards as a kick returner and 500 yards as a punt returner. Prall made it to the final cut with the New York Jets before being released following their final preseason game.

**PSAC CHAMPIONSHIPS:** ESU has won a share of nine PSAC titles under head coach Denny Douds, and 15 in school history. The most recent championships came in 2002 and 2003, when the Warriors tied for the PSAC East championship. Outright PSAC titles came in 1964, 1965, 1975, 1978 and 1982. ESU has a 197-92-1 (.681) record in PSAC games for the third-best winning percentage since the first on-the-field championship was awarded in 1960.

**ESU IN THE DIVISION II PLAYOFFS:** ESU has made three appearances in the Division II Playoffs, with the first coming in 1991, followed by back-to-back trips in 2004 and 2005. The Warriors are 4-3 all-time in playoff games. Their first Division II Playoff victory was a 36-32 win over Edinboro in 2004, while the 2005 playoff run included wins over Southern Connecticut State (55-33), Bloomsburg (52-39) and C.W. Post (55-28) to earn the Northeast Region championship. The run finally ended with a 55-20 loss to eventual national champion Grand Valley State.

**PSAC PRESEASON POLL:** ESU was picked to repeat last year's third-place finish in the PSAC East in the 2007 PSAC Coaches Poll, which was released in early August. The Warriors went 4-2 in the East last season. West Chester was the top choice, followed by 2006 champ Bloomsburg, with Millersville (4th), Kutztown (5th) and Cheyney (6th) rounding out the list. In the West, Cal was picked first with IUP and Slippery Rock tied for second. ESU played all three teams in 2007.

Denny Douds enters his 34th season as the head football coach at East Stroudsburg University as one of three active coaches in NCAA Division II, and one of just 10 coaches in all of college football, with at least 200 career victories.

Douds notched the 200th win of his illustrious career last season when the Warriors defeated Lock Haven 45-14 on Sept. 9 at Eiler-Martin Stadium. The milestone victory launched Douds into some elite company that includes Bobby Bowden and Joe Paterno as one of the handful of active coaches with 200 wins. He begins the 2007 season with 206 career victories.

The Warriors finished the 2006 campaign with a 7-4 record for their seventh straight winning season, the longest such streak of Douds' career. ESU put together six consecutive winning seasons from 1975-1980 after going 5-5 in Douds' first season at the helm of the program in 1974. Douds has sported a winning record as a head coach ever since.

ESU made its second and third appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 2004 and 2005, joining the 1991 squad which also advanced to the postseason. In 2005, the Warriors won three straight playoff games to claim the Northeast Region championship before bowing out in the national semifinals. ESU's 11-3 record set a school record for wins in a single season.

A native of Indiana, Pa., Douds was a high school coach in Erie, Pa. for two years and an assistant coach at West Virginia University for one year before accepting an assistant coach position at ESU.

He started as the Warriors' tight ends and linebackers coach under head coach Charlie Reese, and then became the team's defensive coordinator in 1968. After eight seasons assisting Reese, Douds took over as the school's eighth head football coach in 1974.

Under Douds' direction, the Warriors have captured nine PSAC Eastern Division titles with solo first-place finishes in 1975, 1976, 1978, 1982, 1983 and 1991 and ties for the top spot in 1980, 2002 and 2003.

Before the PSAC championship game was eliminated in 1987, the Warriors won overall conference crowns in 1975, 1978 and 1982 and tied for the title with Shippensburg in 1976.

**COACHING STAFF NOTES:** The 2007 ESU coaching staff has 268 years of combined coaching experience at all levels of football (high school, college and professional). Head coach Denny Douds is in his 45th year of coaching, and 42nd at ESU. He was inducted into the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998. Assistant coaches Mike Terwilliger (1994) and Frank Lupin (2002), both ESU graduates, are also members of the Hall of Fame. Terwilliger is in his 30th season as a football coach, all at ESU, while Lupin is in his 47th year in coaching and 26th at ESU.

Defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator Kenny Stills and outside linebackers coach Joey Smith both have playing experience in the NFL. Stills was a starter in the secondary for the Green Bay Packers and the Minnesota Vikings in an NFL career that spanned from 1986-91, and Smith was a wide receiver and defensive back for the New York Giants from 1991-94.

The ESU staff also has two members that were on two of the greatest Penn State teams of the last 25 years. Rob Mikulski was a letterwinner on the Nittany Lions' national championship team in 1986, while Mike Bender was on the scout team in 1994 when Penn State went undefeated and won the Rose Bowl.

GAME 1

Aug. 27 - Cal 26, ESU 3

CALIFORNIA – No. 21-ranked California held East Stroudsburg University to 53 yards of total offense and minus-38 yards on the ground to post a 26-3 victory in the season opener for both schools at Adamson Stadium.

The Vulcans, who returned all 11 starters off a unit that led the PSAC in scoring defense in 2006, had nine sacks and two interceptions of ESU redshirt sophomore quarterback **Tom O'Brien**, who was making his first career start.

The first set up Cal's first touchdown, an 11-yard pass from Joe Rueggiero from Nate Forse on the first offensive play to give the Vulcans a 6-0 lead with 13:20 to go in the first quarter. Senior linebacker **Dave Lotier** blocked the extra point.

The second interception effectively sealed the win, as linebacker Gary Butler deflected a pass which fell into the hands of defensive lineman Mark Malloy, who returned the ball 20 yards for a touchdown and a 20-3 lead.

The first half was a defensive stalemate, with the Warriors holding Cal to 83 yards of offense, and ESU got on the board with a 24-yard field goal by **Greg Knauss** on the final play of the half. **Mike Gowen** had ESU's second interception of the half with 2:24 left in the second quarter to set the offense up at the 33-yard line. **Mike Gnal** also intercepted Ruggiero to stall a drive in the first quarter.

Cal's first possession of the second half stalled at the 31 before the Vulcans put together their first sustained drive of the game, marching 73 yards on 12 plays. A 31-yard pass to Forse on fourth-and-seven gave Cal a first-and-goal at the two, and Brandon Lombardy scored on a one-yard run to give Cal a 13-3 lead with 7:38 left in the third quarter. Malloy's interception return for a touchdown came with 14:06 left in the fourth quarter, and Ruggiero hit Joe Slappy for a 15-yard touchdown pass to give Cal a 26-3 lead with just over four minutes remaining. **Fred Rice** blocked the PAT for the Warriors.

Redshirt freshman tailback **Brant Quick** had 54 yards on 21 carries for ESU, while O'Brien was 16-of-28 for 91 yards passing. **Sam Shuman** was the leading receiver with four catches for 38 yards.

Ruggiero, a two-time first team All-PSAC West selection at quarterback, was 15-for-25 passing for 155 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. The Warriors limited Lombardy to 95 yards on 24 carries and held the Vulcans to 244 yards of total offense for the game.

GAME 2

Sept. 8 - ESU 58, LHU 13

LOCK HAVEN – Junior quarterback **Tim Roken** threw for 260 yards and four touchdowns, and tailbacks **Brant Quick** and **Joe Partridge** combined for 210 yards and three scores to lead East Stroudsburg University to a 58-13 win at Lock Haven.

Roken threw a pair of 50-yard touchdown passes in his first career start, hitting **Drew Stem** with a 51-yard bomb in the first quarter and **Jeff Giglio** for a 52-yard score in the second quarter.

Quick earned his second straight start and carried 22 times for 115 yards. He opened the scoring with a six-yard run and rolled up 102 yards in the first half. Giglio's first career catch and touchdown made the halftime score 30-13, and the Warriors scored four second half touchdowns to pull away. ESU finished the game scoring the final 35 points.

**Dave Lotier** had an interception and 42-yard return for a touchdown midway through the third quarter to extend the lead to 44-13, and Roken finished the scoring with an 11-yard touchdown pass to **Doug Ogden**.

Ogden was the Warriors leading receiver with five catches for 52 yards and a touchdown, while Chris Hawkins caught seven passes for 82 yards for Lock Haven. The Bald Eagles threw four interceptions, two each by DiPaolo and Jason Eby.

GAME 3

Sept. 15 - IUP 38, ESU 23

EAST STROUDSBURG - IUP scored the final 21 points of the game to beat East Stroudsburg University 38-23 in the first night football game in Eiler-Martin Stadium history.

ESU went ahead 23-17 on a 37-yard field goal by sophomore **Greg Knauss** with 14:08 left in the game, but the Crimson Hawks put together a 62-yard drive to take the lead for good. Andrew Krewatch hit Anthony Rodriguez for a 21-yard touchdown that capped the drive, and the extra point by Craig Burgess gave IUP a 24-23 edge.

Kareem Dutrieuille scored on a 25-yard run with 3:19 remaining to put IUP ahead 31-23, and Terrence Jackson returned a fumble 49 yards for a touchdown to put the game away less than a minute later.

Knauss made a school-record 53-yard field goal at the end of the first half to give ESU a 20-17 advantage at the break, and made three field goals in the game.

The Warriors opened the scoring with a seven-yard touchdown pass from **Tim Roken** to **Sam Shuman** that was set up by a 71-yard interception return by **Steve Van Alstine**, who picked off a pass at the three-yard line to thwart IUP's first drive of the game.

IUP answered with two touchdowns, on a seven-yard run by Poohbear McNeal and a six-yard pass from Krewatch to Dan Pickens, to take a 14-7 lead in the second quarter.

Knauss and Matt McNelis traded field goals to maintain the Crimson Hawks' seven-point edge before Roken hooked up with Shuman for a 65-yard touchdown, their second of the first half, to level the score at 17-17 with 5:41 remaining. Knauss drilled his 53-yard field goal at the gun to give ESU a three-point lead at halftime.

IUP outgained ESU 414-306 for the game and held a 170-32 advantage in rushing yards, led by McNeal (21-103) and Dutrieuille (16-76). Krewatch was 16-for-32 for 244 yards and two touchdowns. Ken Witter (four catches, 82 yards) and Mychal Skinner (two catches, 62 yards) were the top targets.

Roken was 18-for-39 for 259 yards through the air for ESU and also caught a 15-yard pass from tailback Brant Quick. Drew Stem (6-51), Doug Ogden (4-78) and Shuman (3-88, 2 TD) were the top receivers for the Warriors.

Senior inside linebackers **Dave Lotier** and **Jayson Frank** made 13 and 12 tackles, respectively, to lead the ESU defense.

### Sept. 29 - Mville 36, ESU 24

EAST STROUDSBURG - Freshman quarterback Jamal Smith ran for 136 yards and threw for 157 yards and two touchdowns to lead Millersville to a 36-24 win in the PSAC East opener for both schools.

Smith led a Millersville offense that failed to produce a touchdown in its first four games but struck for a pair of first quarter scores, on three-yard runs by Cardoza Jacks and Brad Lantz. Smith completed only 5-of-12 passes for the day but found Jimmie Cotton for a 36-yard score with 6:25 left in the half to take a 20-0 advantage.

**Jayson Frank** (14 tackles) intercepted a pass deep in Millersville territory and returned the ball 15 yards to the three-yard line to set up the Warriors' only touchdown of the first half, as **Joe Partridge** scored on a one-yard run with 3:00 remaining in the half to cut the deficit to 20-7 at intermission.

Partridge carried 34 times for 284 yards to break the single-game rushing record of 267 yards, which was set by Andre Myers against Mansfield in 1998. He ran for four touchdowns, all in the first half, to tie the record shared by three other players.

ESU won its 28th straight game against Cheyney, setting the Division II record that was shared with Minn.-Duluth, who won 27 straight over Wisc.-Superior from 1962-89. The Warriors own the all-time series 51-1.

Partridge ran for 103 yards on 12 carries in the first quarter, and 109 yards on 12 carries in the second quarter. He started his day with runs of 17 and 23 yards on the Warriors' first two snaps, and scored from three yards out to give ESU a 7-0 lead with 12:23 left in the opening period.

He added a two-yard touchdown with 1:58 left in the first quarter, and scored on a 34-yard run two minutes into the second quarter.

Cheyney scored its only touchdown on a one-yard run by quarterback Derrick Murry to complete an 11-play, 46-yard drive.

Partridge carried the ball on the first eight plays of ESU's ensuing possession, gaining 57 yards, and scored his fourth touchdown of the game on fourth-and-goal from the two to put the Warriors ahead 28-6. **David Castillo** had his first career interception on the final play of the half to preserve the lead.

Quarterback **Tom O'Brien**, making his second career start, hooked up with freshman **Jon Clouse** for the only scoring of the second half, finding Clouse for a 15-yard touchdown in the third quarter and a 29-yard score early in the fourth. O'Brien was 8-of-15 for 114 yards and Clouse had the first four catches of his career for 76 yards.

Partridge set the record with a 12-yard run midway through the third quarter and carried one more time, for five yards, before being leaving the game for redshirt freshman Brant Quick. Quick ran seven times for 62 yards in the contest, and ESU accumulated 337 yards rushing on 45 carries in the game.

Murry entered the game averaging 254.0 yards passing but was limited to a 6-of-18 day for 65 yards before he left in the fourth quarter. Cheyney had 219 yards of total offense and 114 yards passing. Billy Mitchell ran for 102 yards on 21 carries for the Wolves.
