



East Stroudsburg University Warriors 2008 Season (9-2, 5-2)

POST SEASON AWARDS: Seniors **Nick Krut**, **Lionel Mitchell**, **Miguel Rivera** and **Keith Weaver** were all named to the All-PSAC East first team for the 2008 season. Krut (Clarks Summit/Abington Heights) was named the top punter in the PSAC East for the second straight year. His 46.0-yard avg. led Division II, while ESU's 39.7 yards per punt was two yards better than any other team in the country. Krut's season average placed third across all divisions of college football, trailing only Idaho's T.J. Conley and Jacob Richardson of Miami (Ohio), and his 42.4-yard career average is an ESU record.

Mitchell (Snellville, Ga./Hargrave Military Academy), a transfer from Alabama, caught the eye of the conference this season with his dominating play at cornerback in his only season with the Warriors. In 10 starts, Mitchell recorded 44 tackles and broke up four passes while being rarely tested. His presence allowed sophomore **David Castillo** to finish second in the PSAC with 15 passes defensed, including three interceptions.

Rivera (Bethlehem/Liberty) was a second team All-PSAC East selection as a junior in 2007 and his 35 tackles, 2.0 sacks, and 5.5 TFL earned first team honors this season. In 31 games at ESU, the standout defensive lineman compiled 93 tackles and 9.5 TFL.

Weaver (Upper Black Eddy/Palisades) was a consistent force at left guard for the Warriors in 2008. His pass protection helped ESU lead the conference in passing with 298.9 yards per game, allowing just two sacks in 350 pass attempts for the season. Weaver, who was named game captain five times this season, also helped pave the way on the ground for running backs **Joe Partridge** and **Jesse Reider**, who combined for seven games of 75-plus yards and 15 touchdowns on the season.

Three additional Warriors earned post season honors as Sr. WR **Drew Stem**, R-Jr. RG **Morgan Thomas** and R-So. OLB **Matt Freed** were selected to the All-PSAC East second team. Stem (Lincoln/Salesianum) picked up another second team selection this year after registering his first after the 2007 season. He represents the receiving corp on the All-PSAC team with his 31 receptions for 383 yards and four touchdowns.

Thomas (Allentown/Parkland) started 10 games at right guard in 2008, missing one because of injury. He played a key role in ESU's back-to-back 400-yard passing performances this year, as well as Partridge's school-record 284-yards rushing against Cheyney in 2007. Thomas has started 31 games in his college career, including 11 games at right tackle as a redshirt freshman in 2006.

Freed (Souderton/Souderton) won PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week honors three times during the 2008 season. The outside linebacker was a second team selection despite leading the conference in tackles with 126. Freed, whose average tackles per game of 11.5 tied him for fifth in all of Division II, also recorded 11.0 TFL, 4.0 sacks, four interceptions, two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble. He had at least 13 tackles in each of his first three starts of the season and five times overall.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: R-So. QB **Matt Marshall** earned PSAC East Offensive Player of the Week honors for the second week in a row for his performance in the season finale at Slippery Rock. Marshall threw for 365 yards and 4 TD in his second career start. The week before, Marshall came off the bench against Millersville and threw for 258 yards and 2 TD in 2 1/2 quarters of play. He had 314 yards passing and three TDs in his first career start against Cheyney earlier in the season and threw for 937 yards and nine touchdowns in less than three full games in 2008. R-So. OLB **Matt Freed** took home the PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week award after his 13-tackle performance against The Rock. Freed, who also recorded an interception, was named the top defender in the PSAC East three times this season. He made 126 tackles (11.5 per game) and recorded 11.0 tackles for a loss, four sacks, two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble along with four interceptions this season.

DOUDS MILESTONES: ESU head coach **Denny Douds** reached a new milestone nearly every week during his 35th season on the sidelines for the Warriors. He came into the season with 209 career victories, three away from tying Millersville's Gene Carpenter's PSAC record of 212 career wins. He tied the record with a 49-28 win at Clarion on Sept. 13 and broke it in thrilling fashion with a 10-point fourth quarter comeback in a 44-41 (OT) win over Shippensburg on Sept. 20. Since then, Douds has coached his 200th career PSAC East game (Sept. 27 vs. Cheyney), won his 216th game to give him half of the 432 wins in program history (Oct. 25 at C.W. Post) and posted his 100th career road win (Nov. 1, 45-18 at Millersville).

A win over Slippery Rock in the final game of the season gave Douds the 218th of his career - 212 more than his career total following the Warriors' only win over his alma mater, a 7-0 victory in the season opener on their way to an undefeated season and PSAC championship in 1975.

NINE WIN SEASONS: East Stroudsburg has won nine games in a season eight times in 81 years of varsity football, including seven times under head coach Denny Douds. A list of the Warriors' nine-win years: 1965 (10-0), 1975 (10-0), 1976 (9-0-1), 1978 (10-1), 1982 (9-2), 2004 (10-2), 2005 (11-3), 2008 (9-2).

SENIOR DAY: The Warriors' 15 seniors finished their ESU careers with a 38-21 victory over Slippery Rock in the season finale. Ten members of ESU's senior class were members on the 2005 Northeast Region championship team that finished with an 11-3 record and played in the Division II semifinals - OL **David Bieber**, WR **Doug Ogden**, OLB **David Pacchioni**, TB **Joe Partridge**, FB **Jesse Reider**, LB **Fred Rice**, QB **Tim Roken**, DL **Jeff Shrive**, WR **Drew Stem** and LB **Steve Van Alstine**. Another five players - OL **Ryan Ehrie**, P **Nick Krut**, DB **Lionel Mitchell**, DL **Miguel Rivera** and OL **Keith Weaver** - have since joined the program. In the last four seasons, ESU had a 31-15 record and went 15-9 in PSAC East contests.

REGIONAL RANKINGS: ESU finished the season ranked No. 8 in the Super Regional 1 (formerly the Northeast Region) rankings, which were released on November 10. The Warriors were No. 8 in the initial rankings and rose to No. 7 before dropping to No. 9 and subsequently moving back up to No. 8 following their victory at Slippery Rock. Six schools were selected for the NCAA Division II playoffs in each of the country's four regions. Earned access was given to a school if it was among the top eight in the region and the only representative of its conference, with the regional rankings filling the remainder of the playoff field.

Bloomsburg, which ESU lost to 42-23 on October 11, finished the season ranked No. 1 in the region and earned a bye in the first round of the Division II playoffs. West Chester, which beat ESU 34-24 back on October 4, came in at No. 4 and knocked off No. 5 seed Southern Connecticut State 52-32 in the first round. California (Pa.) finished No. 2 and received the other first round bye after beating West Chester in the PSAC Championship Game.

NATIONAL LEADER: Sr. P **Nick Krut** led Division II in punting in 2008 with a 46.0-yard average, beating out the second place finisher Will Batson of North Alabama by 1.5 yards. Krut led the nation every week since his 57.5-yard average on four punts at Clarion in the third week of the season. This marks the second time a Warriors punter has led the nation in punting - Adam Hostetter set the school record with a 44.4-yard average in 2001.

Along with setting ESU's single-season record, Krut also broke the 30-year old school record for career average, formerly held by Jim Villani (40.5-yard average, 1978-79). He finished his career with a 42.4-yard average on 120 punts, had 25 punts of 50+ yards and 38 inside the 20-yard line.

Krut was first team All-PSAC East last season, finishing second in the PSAC with a 40.7-yard average and is an All-America candidate this season. His senior year included:

- * the top single-game performance in Division II (min. 2 punts) with a 57.5-yd avg. at Clarion, including kicks of 59, 61 and 63 yards
- * a punt of at least 60 yards in seven of the Warriors' 11 games this season
- * a career-long 73-yard punt that rolled into the end zone vs. Kutztown
- * a 67-yard punt that was downed at the five-yard line vs. West Chester
- * a 57-yard punt that was downed at the two-yard line and two others downed inside the 10-yard line at Bloomsburg
- * an average of at least 40 yards per punt, and a punt of at least 48 yards, in every game this season

EAST STROUDSBURG UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

FREED FIFTH IN THE NATION: R-So. OLB **Matt Freed** led the PSAC and tied for fifth in Division II with 11.5 tackles per game this season. He led ESU in tackles in 10 of the 11 games, including a career-high 16 tackles vs. West Chester. He was the d2football.com Defensive Player of the Week following his 15 tackle, two sack, two interception performance against Gannon, and also earned PSAC East recognition at C.W. Post with 10 tackles, a sack and forced fumble, and a 30-yard interception return for a TD and in the season finale at Slippery Rock with 13 tackles and an interception.

Freed is the third ESU player since 2000 to record at least 100 tackles in a season, surpassing the mark in the ninth game of the year. Fred Rice (132) and John Vetter (119) both accomplished the feat during a 14-game season in 2005. Kevin Nagle, a four-time All-PSAC East first team selection and two-time PSAC East Defensive Player of the Year, surpassed the 100-tackle mark in 1998, 1999 and 2000.

THROWIN' WITH ROKEN: R-Sr. QB **Tim Roken** threw for 150 yards and two touchdowns (96 yards to Ed Kiser, 42 yards to Doug Ogden) at Millersville despite suffering a hand injury on ESU's first series which forced him to leave in the second quarter. Even though he missed 2 1/2 games due to injury in 2008, Roken still left his mark on the long line of quarterbacks in school history.

Roken threw for 300 yards three times this season, including the second back-to-back 400-yard games in ESU history against Clarion (420 yds) and Shippensburg (414 yds). He was one of five quarterbacks in Division II with two 400-yard passing games this year.

In his 16 career starts, Roken threw for 3,933 yards and 32 touchdowns. His career average of 245.8 yards per game ranks third behind Jimmy Terwilliger (299.0) and Damian Poalucci (286.8) among quarterbacks that started at least two seasons at ESU (not counting Poalucci's 10 games as the holder as a freshman in 1994).

Despite leaving early in the game against Millersville, Roken still finished the season ranked third in the PSAC in total offense (252.2 ypg) and fourth in passing (240.9), and his quarterback rating of 137.0 is sixth in a single season behind only Terwilliger's four seasons and Poalucci's 1996 campaign.

This season, Roken:

- * was named PSAC East Offensive Player of the Week following the win at Clarion (6 TD - 5 pass)
- * set ESU's single-game record for passing attempts with 59 vs. Shippensburg
- * had two games with 400 yards of total offense - 435 at Clarion; 424 vs. Shippensburg
- * matched Jimmy Terwilliger with two career 400-yard passing games
- * become the second ESU QB to have consecutive 400-yard passing games (Damian Poalucci, 1996)
- * had the fourth-highest two-game passing yardage total in school history

ROKEN IN 2007: Threw for 1,765 yards with 15 TD and seven interceptions in seven starts ... ranked second in the PSAC in total offense (269.0 ypg) and third in passing (252.1 ypg) ... had at least 200 yards passing in six starts and closed the year with a season-high 312 yards in a comeback win at Kutztown.

THE MARSHALL PLAN: R-So. QB **Matt Marshall** was 1-for-8 with three interceptions after throwing a pick on the first pass of his first career start against Cheyney on Sept. 27. After that he was nearly unstoppable, playing the entire game against the Wolves, the final 2 1/2 quarters at Millersville, and starting in ESU's final game of 2008 at Slippery Rock. In his last 10 1/2 quarters of the season, Marshall was 50-for-82 for 937 yards with nine touchdowns, an average of 11.4 yards per attempt and 18.7 yards per completion.

Marshall was 17-for-26 for 314 yards and three TDs in his first career start vs. Cheyney, marking the first time in school history two different quarterbacks have thrown for more than 300 yards in consecutive weeks. Roken had 420 and 414 yards in the previous two games.

Five of his nine TD passes went to R-So. WR **Jeff Giglio**. Four of those went for at least 30-yards, including 36 and 39 yards (vs. Cheyney) and 34 and 86 yards (at Millersville). Giglio has 15 catches for 383 yards (25.5 avg.) with Marshall at quarterback this season.

IN THE RED ZONE: The ESU offense was nearly perfect in the red zone all season, converting on 43 of its 48 trips. In PSAC East games, the Warriors were 30-of-32, with 21 TDs and nine field goals by Jr. K **Greg Knauss**. Defensively, ESU finished first overall (22-34) and second in conference games (13-21).

THIRD DOWN SUCCESS: The Warriors finished second in the PSAC in third down offense (46.1 percent) a year after ranking 12th of 14 schools with a 27.3 percent rate. The Warriors converted at least half of their chances five times in 2008. On the defensive side, five ESU's 11 opponents converted less than 20 percent of their third down chances.

GOING THE DISTANCE (PART I): R-So. WR **Ed Kiser** hauled in a 96-yard touchdown pass from R-Sr. QB **Tim Roken**, the second-longest pass play in school history, in the first quarter at Millersville. There are six 90-yard pass plays in the ESU record book, all thrown and caught by different players, with the school record a 99-yarder from Bret Comp to Ken Kopetchny at Mansfield in 1990. None of the six were thrown by Jimmy Terwilliger, the NCAA Division II record holder with 14,350 career passing yards. Mike Terwilliger, Jimmy's father and an assistant coach for the last 31 years, threw a 94-yard pass to Tom Palubinski vs. Bloomsburg in 1976, which moves to third in school history.

GOING THE DISTANCE (PART II): R-So. WR **Jeff Giglio** hauled in an 86-yard touchdown pass from R-So. QB **Matt Marshall** in the fourth quarter at Millersville. Giglio and Kiser were track stars in high school - Giglio clocked school records in the 100 (10.6 seconds) and 200 (21.5) at Freedom HS, and Kiser was second in the state in the 400 (48.2) at Red Lion HS. Kiser has continued his success on the track at ESU, holding the school record in the indoor 400 (49.49) and running on three school record relay teams.

GOING THE DISTANCE (PART III): R-Jr. DE **Matthew Faas** (not a track star) returned a fumbled snap on a field goal 75 yards for a touchdown vs. West Chester. The score was the first defensive fumble recovery for a touchdown for the Warriors since Phil DeCecco had a 43-yard return against Cheyney in 2002.

20-PLUS CLUB: R-Sr. WR **Doug Ogden** averaged 21.2 yards per catch this year, finishing second on the Warriors with 39 receptions for 825 yards. He has 16 catches for 374 yards and four TDs in the final three games of the season, including eight catches for 194 yards (the most in the PSAC this season) and a TD at C.W. Post.

Ogden is in the exclusive company of nine other Warriors wide receivers who averaged at least 20 yards per reception (min. 20 rec. / 500 yds.) since 1980. The school record of 30.3 yards per catch was set by Tim Bishop (18 rec., 546 yds.) in 1983.

BALANCING ACT: R-Sr. WR **Doug Ogden** and R-So. WR **Jeff Giglio** both finished in the top 10 in the PSAC in receiving yards per game, giving ESU the only pair of teammates in the conference with that accomplishment.

Ogden led ESU with 825 yards and Giglio had team-highs with 41 catches and 10 touchdowns. All five wide receivers caught at least 24 passes and four of the five averaged at least 15 yards per catch, led by Ogden's average of 21.2.

EAST STROUDSBURG UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

PITCHING THE PIGSKIN: R-Jr. WR **Sam Shuman**, a former high school quarterback, threw his first career TD pass to Sr. WR **Drew Stem** (16 yards) against Millersville earlier this season. He also had completions of 57 yards to R-So. WR **Ed Kiser** at Bloomsburg and 41 yards to Stem at Slippery Rock. Shuman led ESU with 31 catches for 545 yards through the first eight weeks but took a back seat to Ogden and Giglio in the final three games. Shuman was the Warriors' leading receiver with 36 catches for 534 yards a year ago.

FIVE BY FIVE (PART I): All five wide receivers caught at least five passes in ESU's comeback win over Shippensburg, led by R-Sr. **Doug Ogden** (8-163) and R-Jr. **Sam Shuman** (6-111). R-Sr. QB **Tim Roken**'s 31 completions were fifth-most in school history in a single game.

FIVE BY FIVE (PART II): All five wide receivers were involved in at least one scoring play at Millersville:

THE RUNNING GAME: The Warriors ran for 151.5 yards per game over the final four weeks of the season (160 vs. Kutztown, 149 at C.W. Post, 148 at Millersville, 149 at Slippery Rock) after averaging 99.1 yards per game through the first seven games. Sr. FB **Jesse Reider** ran for 224 yards and four touchdowns on 58 carries during the final three games while replacing R-Sr. TB **Joe Partridge**, who left the C.W. Post game due to injury in the second quarter. He had 21 carries for 76 yards and two TD in relief of Partridge, carried 22 times for 91 yards and a TD at Millersville, and 15 carries for 57 yards and a TD at Slippery Rock.

Reider entered the game at C.W. Post with 25 carries in his career, including eight carries for 74 yards and two TDs while playing fullback and tailback earlier in the season vs. Cheyney. Reider was ESU's Redshirt Award winner in 2007 and was a key contributor on special teams throughout his career, making 23 tackles. He started 10 career games at fullback and one at tailback.

Partridge had eight carries for 35 yards and a TD before leaving vs. C.W. Post. The previous week, he had 27 carries for 97 yards vs. Kutztown, nearly topping the 100-yard mark for the third time in his career. Partridge returned from injury in the fourth quarter against Slippery Rock, notching 11 carries for 85 yards. He finished his career with 1,658 yards and 17 touchdowns, averaging 5.0 yards per carry as a two-year starter. He also had games of 78 yards (vs. Cheyney), 83 yards (vs. Gannon) and 91 yards (at Bloomsburg) in 2008

As a junior, Partridge ran for 698 yards and seven touchdowns, including a school-record 284 yards and four TDs at Cheyney. He was second team All-PSAC East and was fifth in the PSAC with 87.2 yards per game.

FALLING FORWARD: Partridge had 331 carries in his career at ESU and was hit for a loss only a handful of times, suffering only 23 yards worth of losses in his four years with the Warriors.

CAREER-HIGH: R-Fr. TB **Russell Johnson** had the best game of his young career against Kutztown, carrying nine times for 51 yards and a touchdown. He started consecutive games against Clarion and Shippensburg and averaged just 2.7 yards per carry entering the game, but broke a career-long 26-yard run, caught a 17-yard pass and scored on a six-yard run against the Golden Bears.

HITTING 100: The Warriors' offense is known nationally for its prolific passing attack, but also featured at least one 100-yard rushing game every season since 1990. That streak ended this season when the Warriors failed to have a 100-yard rusher at Slippery Rock. ESU backs went over 75 yards seven times this season, with Partridge coming the closest with 97 yards vs. Kutztown, followed by a pair of 91-yard games, one each by Partridge and Reider.

IN THE FRONT ROW: ESU started the same five players on the offensive line through the first six games before making its first change of the season at Bloomsburg when R-Jr. RG **Morgan Thomas** was held out due to injury. Thomas had started all 26 games of his career at ESU before missing the Bloomsburg game. Sr. **David Biever**, who started nine games at guard in 2006, started in place of Thomas. The Warriors used four different combinations last season.

EAST STROUDSBURG UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

Three Warriors made their first career starts on the offensive line this season - Gr. LT **Ryan Ehrle**, Sr. LG **Keith Weaver** and R-Fr. C **Dan Caffrey**. On the right side, Thomas will enter his senior year with 30 career starts and R-Jr. T **Matthew Keller** has 18 career starts, all at right tackle.

Ehrle was a graduate student in Education at ESU and transferred from Syracuse, where he was a letterwinner on the offensive line and majored in History and Political Science. Weaver finished his second year at ESU after playing at Lackawanna JC, and Caffrey was redshirted as a defensive lineman in 2007.

THE HEAVY PACKAGE: ESU showed great offensive versatility this season, often sending out five wide receivers on one play and then replacing them with tight ends and fullbacks on the next. Sr. OL **David Biever** (72) and Jr. OL **Dan Finnegan** (68) both started at tight end at Millersville, and Biever and R-So. FB **Brent Jones** started vs. Cheyney in front of Partridge and Reider. R-Jr. TE **Willie Bell** provided a pass catching element, with six receptions for 124 yards, including two catches for 63 yards on back-to-back plays at Millersville.

KNAUSS KNOTES: Jr. K **Greg Knauss**, a first team All-PSAC East and second team All-Northeast Region selection in 2007, made 12 of his last 16 field goals in 2008. Knauss was 2-of-4 at C.W. Post, with his misses coming from 52 and 53 yards. He made a season-long 44-yard kick at the end of the first half the previous week vs. Kutztown. Knauss was 11-of-12 from inside 40 yards this season and 19-of-23 from that distance in his career. His 44-yard field goal at the end of the first half against Kutztown was his only from beyond 40 yards this season after going 4-of-5 from 40-49 yards a year ago.

Knauss has had two game-winning field goals for the Warriors, making a 29-yarder in overtime against Shippensburg this season and a 40-yarder with 18 seconds left for a 24-23 win at Kutztown in 2007's season finale. He also set two school records in 2007, with a 53-yarder vs. IUP and five field goals in a 30-15 loss at West Chester. Knauss was third in Division II with 1.4 field goals per game and was 13-of-19 in 2007.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Sr. WR **Drew Stem** finished his ESU career ranked second in school history in kick return average at 26.1 yards per return. He also had a career day returning punts vs. Kutztown, with seven returns for 108 yards. Stem averaged 143.2 all-purpose yards per game in 2007, including 268 yards vs. Millersville. He was a second team All-PSAC East selection at wide receiver in each of his last two seasons.

BACK IN BUSINESS: Three of the Warrior's four linebackers in 2008 were returning starters, with R-So. OLB **Matt Freed**, who finished the season tied for fifth in the nation in tackles, stepping into a starting role for the first time in 2008. R-Sr. ILB **Steve Van Alstine** (31 starts), R-Sr. OLB **David Pacchioni** (30 starts) and R-Sr. ILB **Fred Rice** (25 starts) gave the Warriors a veteran linebacking corps that ranked among the best in the PSAC.

LOWERING THE BOOM: Fred "Boomer" Rice moved into ESU's school record book as he finished his career with 278 career tackles, sixth in program history and two behind former teammate Greg Thomas in the fifth spot. Thoman recorded 280 tackles for ESU from 2002-2005. Rice finished 10th in the PSAC with 7.9 tackles per game (79 tackles) and hit double figures in tackles in the first four games this season - 11 vs. Virginia Union, 11 vs. Gannon, 12 at Clarion and 10 vs. Shippensburg. Rice made 25 career starts for the Warriors but hadn't started since the first three games of the 2006 season before missing the rest of the year due to injury. He played behind PSAC East selections Jayson Frank and Dave Lotier in 2007. Rice started 12 games and led the Warriors with 132 tackles during his sophomore season in 2005.

VETERAN LEADERSHIP: Pacchioni and Van Alstine both finished 2008 with more than 50 tackles and were the Warriors' starting outside linebackers the last two seasons before Van Alstine moved inside this year. Van Alstine was ESU's leading returning tackler entering the season, with 53 stops in 2007, while Pacchioni was one of the most versatile defenders in the PSAC, recording 47 tackles, 7.0 TFL and two interceptions last season. He had 3.5 sacks this season and sacked Bloomsburg quarterback Dan Latorre in the end zone for a safety three weeks ago.

THE NEXT GENERATION: A trio of freshmen linebackers (R-Fr. ILB **Taylor Cave**, Fr. ILB **Mike Bergey** and R-Fr. OLB **Bryan Billger**) saw significant action at C.W. Post with Rice out for the entire game and Freed missing the second half. Cave made his first career start and had five tackles, Bergey had four tackles, and Billger was in on three tackles for the Warriors defense. Cave saw significant playing time at Millersville and had his first career interception at the goal line to kill a Marauder drive. All three have played an integral role on special teams this season.

BREAK IT UP: So. CB **David Castillo** finished second in the PSAC with 1.3 pass breakups per game (three interceptions, 12 pass break-ups) this season. He broke up two passes in four straight games earlier this season and had an interception and knocked down a pass vs. Shippensburg. He had three of the Warriors' 11 interceptions this season and scored on a 64-yard interception return vs. Gannon. Castillo has made 16 straight starts since moving into the lineup midway through his freshman season.

THE SECONDARY: The ESU secondary returned four players with starting experience and added Sr. CB **Lionel Mitchell**, a transfer from Alabama. The son of former NFL running back Stump Mitchell, Lionel made 10 starts and had five career interceptions (including three for 131 yards in 2006) for the Crimson Tide. He had 44 tackles and four pass breakups this season. R-Fr. CB **Shawnte Carroll** made his first career start at Kutztown and had two pass break-ups at C.W. Post.

Jr. FS **Nicholas Artinger** started 10 games at safety (42 tackles, interception, four pass breakups) this season and also has eight career starts at cornerback. Jr. FS **Mike Gnall** made his only start of the season at Bloomsburg after starting seven games as a sophomore.

THE JERSEY BOYS: ESU rotated three players at defensive end, all natives of the Garden State - R-Fr. **Cody Berry** (Woolwich Township, N.J./Kingsway), R-So. **Jeff Case** (Blairstown, N.J./North Warren) and R-Jr. **Matthew Faas** (Sea Girt, N.J./Wall). Faas started all 11 games and had 35 tackles (9.0 TFL) and two sacks along with his four fumble recoveries. Case made 10 starts and had 33 tackles (5.0 TFL), four pass deflections and 2 sacks. The freshman Berry tied for the team lead with 4.0 sacks, and finished fourth on the team with 7.5 tackles for a loss (32 total tackles).

EAST STROUDSBURG UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

THE PENNSYLVANIA BOYS: At defensive tackle, Sr. **Miguel Rivera** (Bethlehem/Freedom) was a three-year starter and was second team All-PSAC East in 2007. Rivera had 35 tackles, 5.5 TFL and 2 sacks this season and was one of the top interior linemen in the PSAC. R-Sr. **Jeff Shrive** (Scranton/West Scranton) made 20 straight starts and had 33 tackles (5.5 TFL) this year. R-Jr. **Keith Galinsky** (Carbondale/Lakeland) had six tackles in his first career start against Shippensburg and his first career sack at Millersville.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON: Three members of this years team have fathers who earned letters for the Warriors under Coach Douds. They join at least four other father-son combinations who have been affiliated with ESU football since Douds arrived in 1966.

Fr. OLB Sam Hull - father Chris was a four-year letterwinner at DE from 1984-87

R-So. QB Matt Marshall - father Brian was the Warriors' leading passer in 1981

Sr. WR Drew Stem - father Willard was an All-American safety in 1975 and inducted into the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame last year

Michael Falcone lettered at linebacker in 1973, his son Bryan earned three letters at linebacker from 2000-02

Steven Jackson was a three-year letterwinner at center from 1969-71, his son Greg lettered at tight end in 1998 and 1999

Doug McNamee (DB/WR) was a co-captain on the 1966 team, his son Todd was a four-year letterwinner as a kicker and punter from 1985-88

Mike Terwilliger was the starting quarterback for Douds' first four years as head coach and has been an assistant coach since 1978, his son Jimmy was a four-year starter at QB and won the Harlon Hill Award as the top player in Division II in 2005

DIGGING THROUGH THE RECORD BOOK: ESU has produced a long line of record breaking quarterbacks, including Damian Poalucci, who set an NCAA Division II record with 3,831 passing yards in 1996, and Jimmy Terwilliger, who set 15 Division II records and tied the all-division record with 148 touchdown passes in his career from 2003-06.

It wouldn't appear that there are many passing records within reach, but R-Sr. **Tim Roken** and R-So. **Matt Marshall** both reached milestones this season. Roken tied Poalucci's mark with two straight 400-yard passing games against Clarion (420 yards) and Shippensburg (414 yards), and Marshall helped set another record in his first career start vs. Cheyney. He threw for 314 yards, marking the first time in school history two quarterbacks have thrown for at least 300 yards in consecutive weeks.

STARTING STRONG: The Warriors started the season with a 5-0 record, the fourth time they have won their first five games under head coach Denny Douds. ESU was also 5-0 in 1975, 1976 and 2004. The 1975 and 1976 teams won 19 straight games and had a combined 19-0-1 record, and the 2004 squad won the first seven contests on its way to a 10-2 record. The Warriors have won the first five games of the season 12 times in 81 years of varsity football.

PSAC PRESEASON POLL: ESU was picked to finish third in the 2008 PSAC East Coaches Poll, which was released at PSAC media day on August 4. The Warriors, who received one first place vote, were selected behind preseason favorite and defending PSAC East champion West Chester and runner-up Bloomsburg. Shippensburg was fourth, followed by C.W. Post, Kutztown, Millersville and Cheyney.

EAST STROUDSBURG UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

In the West, NCAA semifinalist California was picked to defend its title, followed by IUP, Edinboro and Slippery Rock. ESU is scheduled to play the Rock in the final game of the regular season. The Warriors' other two PSAC West crossover opponents, Clarion and Gannon, were picked sixth and seventh, respectively.

PSAC CHANGES: There were two major developments in the PSAC leading up to the 2008 season - the conference's expansion and the return of the "State Game" - as the conference celebrated 75 years since the first football championship was awarded in 1934. The Eastern and Western division champions played a state championship game from 1960 until 1987, and ESU participated nine times, posting a 5-2-2 record. The Warriors are 3-1-1 in the State Game under Denny Douds, winning outright state titles in 1975, 1978 and 1982, and tying for the crown in 1976.

The expansion of the conference to 16 members with the addition of Gannon and Mercyhurst to the PSAC West provided another storyline for the 2008 season. Shippensburg switched divisions and compete in the PSAC East, and C.W. Post joined the conference as an associate member in football and field hockey.

AND WE GO TO...OVERTIME: ESU broke a four-game losing streak in overtime games with its 44-41 win vs. Shippensburg on Sept. 20. The Warriors have played three overtime games with Shippensburg, all at home, since playing the Raiders in the first overtime game in school history, a 34-33 loss in the NCAA Division II playoffs in 1991. ESU is 3-6 all-time in overtime contests.

NEW SURFACE: FieldTurf was installed at Eiler-Martin Stadium this summer, the latest phase in the renovation of the Warriors' major outdoor facility which has had an all-weather track and lights installed in the last two years. ESU debuted the new surface on Thursday, Aug. 28 with a men's soccer-football doubleheader, as the defending PSAC champion men's soccer team defeated Lincoln 12-0 and the football team knocked off No. 25 Virginia Union 14-11. The estimated total cost to turf the stadium and Whitenight Field was approximately \$1.7 million. The university received a \$300,000 Pennsylvania state challenge grant made possible by State Senator Bob Mellow and \$150,000 was donated from the ESU Student Activity Association. The balance of the funds is being secured through other donations.

WARRIORS ON RADIO: WVPO 840 AM has broadcast ESU football for 46 years, with Chuck Seese and Bob Brittain forming the broadcast team once again in 2008. Seese is in his 20th season as the voice of the Warriors on WVPO. WESS 90.3 FM, ESU's campus radio station, will also broadcast selected games.

PSAC CHAMPIONSHIPS: ESU has won a share of nine PSAC titles under head coach Denny Douds, and 15 in school history. The most recent championships came in 2002 and 2003, when the Warriors tied for the PSAC East championship. Outright PSAC titles came in 1964, 1965, 1975, 1978 and 1982. ESU has a 199-95-1 (.676) record in PSAC games for the third-best winning percentage since the first on-the-field championship was awarded in 1960.

Denny Douds, who finished his his 35th season as the head football coach at East Stroudsburg University, was one of four active coaches in NCAA Division II, and one of just 11 coaches in all of college football, with at least 200 career victories during the 2008 season. He finished the year with 218 career victories and set hte PSAC record with a 44-41 overtime win over Shippensburg on Sept. 20.

There have been more than 70 head football coaches at the other 13 PSAC institutions, and at least four at every school, since Douds took over as ESU's eighth head football coach in 1974. Since then, he has coached 17 AP Little All-Americans, five AFCA All-Americans and five finalists for the Harlon Hill Award, including quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger, who won the award in 2005.

In his 34 years as head coach, Douds has mentored 168 first team All-PSAC selections and 714 letterwinners. An additional 151 players earned letters in his eight years as an assistant coach from 1966-73. Including the numerous Warriors who were members of the team but didn't earn a letter, more than 1,000 players have contributed to the ESU football program during Douds' 43 years in the Poconos.

Along with the PSAC career wins record, Douds reached another milestone for success and longevity in 2008. He has been the head coach for more than half of the 434 wins in program history.

The Warriors were 3-6 in 2007, ending a run of seven straight winning seasons, the longest such streak of Douds' career. ESU put together six consecutive winning seasons from 1975-1980 after going 5-5 in Douds' first season at the helm of the program in 1974. Douds has sported a winning record as a head coach ever since.

ESU made its second and third appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 2004 and 2005, joining the 1991 squad which also advanced to the postseason. In 2005, the Warriors won three straight playoff games to claim the Northeast Region championship before bowing out in the national semifinals. ESU's 11-3 record set a school record for wins in a single season.

A native of Indiana, Pa., Douds was a high school coach in Erie, Pa. for two years and an assistant coach at West Virginia University for one year before accepting an assistant coach position at ESU.

He started as the Warriors' tight ends and linebackers coach under head coach Charlie Reese, and then became the team's defensive coordinator in 1968. After eight seasons assisting Reese, Douds took over as the school's eighth head football coach in 1974.

Under Douds' direction, the Warriors have captured nine PSAC Eastern Division titles with solo first-place finishes in 1975, 1976, 1978, 1982, 1983 and 1991 and ties for the top spot in 1980, 2002 and 2003. Before the PSAC championship game was eliminated in 1987, the Warriors won overall conference crowns in 1975, 1978 and 1982 and tied for the title with Shippensburg in 1976.

Head coach Denny Douds is in his 46th year of coaching, and 43rd at ESU. He was inducted into the ESU Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998. Assistant coaches Mike Terwilliger (1994) and Frank Lupin (2002), both ESU graduates, are also members of the Hall of Fame. Terwilliger is in his 31st season as a football coach, all at ESU, while Lupin is in his 48th year in coaching and 27th at ESU.

The Warriors welcome two new coaches to the staff for the 2008 season. Otis Flowers is the defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator and brings nearly 20 years of coaching experience to the sidelines. His most recent college position was at the University of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, where he coached for the past four years. Nick Bach is the defensive backs coach at video coordinator. He comes to ESU from Otterbein College, where he was the defensive line coach for three seasons.

GAME 1

Aug. 28 - ESU 14, VA Union 11

EAST STROUDSBURG - Senior **Drew Stem** caught a 13-yard touchdown pass from senior **Tim Roken** to give ESU a 14-11 lead midway through the fourth quarter, and the defense blanked the Panthers the rest of the way to give the Warriors an upset victory over No. 25 Virginia Union in the first game on the newly-installed FieldTurf at Eiler-Martin Stadium.

The win is the Warriors' first over a team ranked in the AFCA poll since a 41-34 victory over No. 25 California in 2006. ESU president Dr. Robert Dillman honored state senator Bob Mellow and the ESU Student Activities Association prior to the game for their contributions to the FieldTurf project.

Redshirt freshman **Cody Berry** sacked VUU backup quarterback Cheston Hickman and forced a fumble that junior **Matthew Faas** recovered at the 13-yard line, and Roken hit Stem two plays later to give ESU the lead with 8:29 left. Junior **Greg Knauss** made the PAT.

VUU starting quarterback Lamar Little, a preseason Harlon Hill candidate, returned for the first time since halftime but was unable to rally the Panthers. Michael Hampton returned the ensuing kickoff to the 49, but VUU went three-and-out and senior **Jesse Reider** forced punter Wayne Motley to pull the ball down to turn the ball over on downs at the VUU 41-yard line.

ESU failed to pick up fourth down conversions inside the 20 on its final two possessions, but the Warriors forced VUU to go the length of the field and the defense held the Panthers to 13 net yards in their final seven possessions to seal the victory.

The Warriors led the defensive struggle 7-6 at halftime as the two teams traded first-quarter touchdowns. ESU struck first when senior **Fred Rice** recovered a fumble at the three-yard line and senior **Joe Partridge** went in on the next play to put ESU ahead 7-0 at the 8:27 mark in the first quarter.

Little led the Panthers 65 yards in six plays to put the tying touchdown on the board with a 13-yard run, but Gil Hernandez missed the extra point to keep the score 7-6.

VUU took its first lead with a 33-yard field goal by Hernandez to cap its first drive of the second half (10 plays, 61 yards), and the Panthers' advantage was extended to 11-7 when ESU was flagged for holding in the end zone, resulting in a safety, with just over two minutes left in the third.

Linebackers **Matt Freed** (13 tackles), **Rice** (11), **David Pacchioni** (8) and **Steve Van Alstine** (7) led the Warriors defensively, and ESU limited Virginia Union to 104 yards of total offense in the second half and 259 for the game.

Roken was 12-for-28 for 122 yards and Stem had six catches for 48 yards. Sophomore **Jeff Giglio** had two long kick returns in the first quarter, averaging 47.5 yards per return.

Little was 9-for-20 passing for 96 yards and Hickman was 5-for-9 for 43 yards after entering the game at the start of the third quarter.

GAME 2

Sept. 6 - ESU 23, Gannon 10

EAST STROUDSBURG - Sophomore cornerback **David Castillo** had a 64-yard interception return for a touchdown to break a 7-7 tie in the second quarter and senior quarterback **Tim Roken** and redshirt sophomore **Jeff Giglio** connected for a pair of touchdowns as ESU defeated Gannon 23-10 on a rain-soaked Saturday night at Eiler-Martin Stadium.

Redshirt sophomore outside linebacker **Matt Freed** had 15 tackles, two sacks and two interceptions one week after a 13-tackle outing in his first career start, a 14-11 victory over No. 25 Virginia Union.

Giglio had five catches for 88 yards and scored on plays of 25 yards in the first quarter and 33 yards in the fourth, and Roken was 11-of-20 for 171 yards.

Gannon tailback Jon Richardson ran for 138 yards in the Golden Knights' first game against a PSAC opponent, but quarterbacks Bob Bartley and Zach Boedicker combined to throw three costly interceptions.

Senior tailback **Joe Partridge** gained 45 yards on 10 carries, and Roken's only completion was a 25-yard strike to Giglio on a crossing pattern to give the Warriors a 7-0 lead on the opening drive.

Gannon responded with an eight-play, 69 yard drive that culminated in an eight-yard touchdown pass from Bartley to Matt Davis on the first play of the second quarter.

Castillo stepped in front of a pass early in Gannon's next series and went 64 yards uncontested down the sideline to put the Warriors in front 13-7 after senior kicker **Greg Knauss** missed the extra point.

Richardson ripped the Warriors for gains of 19, 14 and 12 yards on Gannon's opening possession of the second half and Jeremy Ditzler made a 27-yard field goal to cut the deficit to 13-10.

Ditzler had an opportunity to tie the game at 13-all on the final play of the third quarter, but he pushed his 28-yard attempt to the left.

On ESU's next possession, Roken threw for 79 of the Warriors' 80 yards culminating in a 33-yard scoring toss to Giglio, who broke a tackle at the 25-yard line and found the end zone for the second time in the game.

Knauss made a 30-yard field goal with 6:15 remaining in the game to set the final margin.

Senior linebacker **Fred Rice**, the reigning PSAC East defensive player of the week, made 11 tackles and Castillo and fellow defensive backs **Nicholas Artinger** and **Lionel Mitchell** both made six stops.

Senior wide receiver **Doug Ogden** had three catches for 54 yards one week after going over the 1,000-yard mark for his career for an ESU offense that gained 312 yards, 141 rushing and 171 passing. Partridge finished the night with 83 yards on 20 carries and redshirt freshman **Russell Johnson** carried 10 times for 31 yards.

GAME 3

Sept. 13 - ESU 49, Clarion 28

CLARION - Senior quarterback **Tim Roken** threw for 420 yards and five touchdowns and head coach Denny Douds earned his 212th career win to tie the PSAC record as ESU improved to 3-0 with a 49-28 win at Clarion.

Douds matches Millersville's Gene Carpenter as the winningest coach in conference history and has a record of 212-140-3 in 35 seasons as the head coach at ESU.

Roken was 15-of-20 for 283 yards and four touchdowns in the first half as the Warriors built a 35-7 halftime lead. He had 435 yards of total offense for the game.

Redshirt junior **Sam Shuman** had nine catches for 141 yards and two touchdowns and senior **Drew Stem** gained 132 yards on seven catches.

ESU set the tone for the game on the first play from scrimmage when Roken hit senior **Doug Ogden** for a 44-yard gain, and the Warriors were in the end zone four plays later on a seven-yard pass to redshirt sophomore **Ed Kiser** 1:45 into the game.

Clarion answered with a 13 play, 86-yard drive to tie the score at 7-7. Tyler Huether's four-yard run completed the drive.

The rest of the first half was all Warriors, as ESU scored on four of its next five possessions. Roken threw touchdown passes of 34 yards to Ogden, 14 yards to redshirt sophomore **Jeff Giglio** and 34 yards to Shuman and also scored on a three-yard run to cap an 80-yard drive with 1:44 left in the first half.

The defense set up ESU's third touchdown with a fumble recovery at the 33-yard line by redshirt sophomore linebacker **Matt Freed**. Freed (13 tackles) and **Fred Rice** (12) both hit double figures in tackles for the third straight game.

The Warriors went 89 yards on 12 plays on their first possession of the second half to take a 42-7 lead. Redshirt freshman **Russell Johnson** finished the drive with his first career touchdown.

Rometo threw an eight-yard touchdown pass to Foradora on Clarion's next possession, while the Warriors completed their scoring with a 14-yard strike from Roken to Shuman with 11:32 left.

The Golden Eagles put up 290 yards of offense in the second half to finish with a slight edge (460-458) for the game. Nick Sipes (118 yards) and Eddie Emmanuel (105 yards) both topped 100 yards rushing, and Rometo was 22-for-35 for 238 yards.

Senior punter **Nick Krut** had an outstanding game, averaging 57.5 yards on four punts, including kicks of 59, 61 and 63 yards.

GAME 4

Sept. 20 - ESU 44, Ship 41 (OT)

EAST STROUDSBURG – ESU overcame a 10-point deficit in the final six minutes and junior **Greg Knauss** made a 29-yard field goal in overtime to give head coach Denny Douds the PSAC record with his 213th career win in an overtime classic.

Douds, in his 35th season at ESU, broke Gene Carpenter's (Millersville, 1970-2000) PSAC record.

Senior **Tim Roken** threw for 414 yards, 321 in the second half, and was 31-of-59 to set a school record for passing attempts. He threw four first-half interceptions but led ESU back four 10-point deficits before tying the game with 1:02 left.

Roken was 5-of-6 for 91 yards while on a seven play, 87-yard drive that was capped by a one-yard touchdown run by senior tailback **Joe Partridge** that tied the game at 41-41.

The drive included big plays to redshirt junior **Sam Shuman** (6 catches, 111 yards) for 26 and 21 yards, and senior **Doug Ogden** (8-163) for 27 and 14 yards, the final catch setting up Partridge's third TD of the game.

Kyler Ford pushed a 30-yard field goal wide left to turn the ball over to the Warriors. Partridge ripped a 13-yard run, and Knauss came on to kick his second career game-winning field goal.

Ship (1-3, 0-1) turned five turnovers into a 21-7 halftime lead before ESU (4-0, 1-0) put up 34 second-half points. The three touchdown drives covered 27, seven and 23 yards and were all set up by interceptions.

Partridge scored on runs of one and seven yards in the third quarter, the second set up by an interception by sophomore cornerback **David Castillo**, as ESU pulled within 28-24.

Kevin Marshall (15 carries, 87 yards) had two long scoring plays for Ship in the fourth, starting with a 59-yard run that put his team ahead 35-24 with 10:29 left.

ESU trimmed the margin to 35-31 when Roken hit senior **Drew Stem** for a touchdown on 4th-and-2 from the four-yard line. Marshall returned the ensuing kickoff 91 yards for a touchdown, but Ford missed the PAT to keep the score 41-31 with 6:58 on the clock.

An unsportsmanlike conduct flag forced Ship to kick off from the 15-yard line and Stem ran it back to the 40. A 25-yard pass from Stem to redshirt sophomore **Ed Kiser** set up a 24-yard field goal by Knauss to pull ESU within 41-34.

ESU ran 90 plays, the fourth-most in school history, and had 531 yards of total offense. Ship was led by Chad DiFebbo (161 pass yards) and Mike Harris (5 catches, 74 yards, 2 TD). The Warriors held Chris Infante, Ship's leading rusher, to 14 carries for 20 yards (2 TD).

EAST STROUDSBURG - Redshirt sophomore quarterback **Matt Marshall** threw for 314 yards and three touchdowns, two to redshirt sophomore **Jeff Giglio**, and senior fullback **Jesse Reider** ran for two scores to lead ESU to a 52-12 win over Cheyney at Eiler-Martin Stadium.

The Warriors improve to 5-0, the fourth time they have started a season with five straight wins in 35 seasons under head coach Denny Douds, going into next Saturday's PSAC East showdown with West Chester at 3 p.m.

Marshall was 17-for-26 in his first career start while replacing redshirt senior **Tim Roken**, who threw for more than 400 yards each of the last two weeks.

Giglio had three catches for 87 yards and two scores, and redshirt junior **Sam Shuman** had five catches for 96 yards. Reider (eight carries, 74 yards) and redshirt senior **Joe Partridge** (19-78, TD) contributed to a rushing attack that gained a season-high 215 yards.

Redshirt freshman **Ray Wagner** also threw a touchdown pass on his first collegiate attempt, a 44-yarder to redshirt sophomore **Ed Kiser**.

Partridge scored on a two-yard run to put the Warriors on the board with 3:15 left in the first quarter, and Reider found the end zone from one yard out for his first touchdown of the year early in the second quarter. Junior kicker **Greg Knauss** hit a 27-yard field goal and Giglio hauled in his first TD catch of the game to give the Warriors a 24-0 lead at halftime.

Marshall was 10-for-15 for 179 yards in the opening half and shook off an early interception. He stayed hot in the third quarter, going 6-for-9 for 109 yards and two scores, hooking up with Giglio senior **Drew Stem** for scores.

Partridge had 18 of his 19 carries in the first half and Reider moved to the tailback position for most of the second half. Redshirt sophomore **Zack Krise** ran 10 times for 36 yards.

Chinoso Okoro provided the bulk of Cheyney's offense, scoring on runs of 40 and 44 yards, and had 107 yards on 19 carries on the night. Ronald Thompson threw for 171 yards, including a 57-yard throw on a flea flicker to Darryl Jones on the Wolves' first offensive play.

Redshirt sophomore linebacker **Matt Freed** had 11 tackles, his fourth game in double figures, to lead the defense. **Nick Krut**, the nation's leading punter, maintained his average with three punts for a 46.0-yard average.

ESU extended Division II's longest winning streak over one opponent with its 29th consecutive victory over Cheyney and improved to 52-1 in the all-time series.

Oct. 4 - West Chester 34, ESU 24

EAST STROUDSBURG - Joe Wright threw two touchdown passes to Mike Washington and West Chester scored the final 21 points of the game to hand ESU its first loss of the season, 34-24, on Homecoming at Eiler-Martin Stadium.

Redshirt freshman tailback Jackson Fagan ran 25 times for 178 yards as West Chester (4-2, 3-0) had 475 yards of total offense and held the ball for more than 37 minutes in the contest.

Wright was 12-of-23 for 259 yards and also ran for a touchdown. Washington had four catches for 126 yards and set the PSAC record with 51 career touchdown passes, surpassing the previous mark of 50 held by ESU All-American Evan Prall.

The lead changed hands three times in the first half, with ESU holding a 17-13 advantage at halftime after a 75-yard fumble return for a touchdown by defensive end **Matthew Faas** after a fumbled snap on a field goal midway through the second quarter.

Redshirt senior quarterback **Tim Roken** hit redshirt senior **Doug Ogden** for a pair of scores for the Warriors (5-1, 2-1), the second from 17 yards to complete an 81-yard drive that gave ESU a 24-13 lead early in the second half.

West Chester pulled within 24-20 on a 13-yard touchdown run by fullback Pat McDermott on its next possession.

The ESU defense came up with two fourth-down stops in the second half, including a fourth-and-five at the 33-yard line with 12:41 remaining, but Dan DePalma intercepted a pass by Roken and returned it 40 yards for a touchdown that put the Golden Rams ahead for good.

ESU went three-and-out and senior **Nick Krut** hit a career-long 67-yarder that rolled dead at the five-yard line. West Chester embarked on a 10 play, 95-yard drive that included 63 all-purpose yards from tailback Jackson Fagan.

Wright hit Washington for a 23-yard touchdown and ESU turned the ball over on downs with 4:13 left. The Golden Rams picked up two first downs to drain all but the final 19 seconds off the clock.

Roken was 13-for-33 for 215 yards and ESU managed 289 yards of total offense. **Sam Shuman** pulled in four passes for 82 yards and Ogden had three catches for 68 yards and the 14th and 15th touchdowns of his career.

Redshirt sophomore outside linebacker **Matt Freed** was in on 16 tackles for the Warriors defense, which was on the field for more than 20 minutes in the second half.

GAME 7

Oct. 11 - Bloomsburg 42, ESU 23

BLOOMSBURG - No. 6-ranked Bloomsburg ran out to a 35-7 halftime lead and withstood ESU's comeback bid for a 42-23 win at Redman Stadium. The Huskies (7-0, 4-0 PSAC East) used an interception return for a touchdown by Vince Browning and scored on all four of their first-half possessions before ESU got back in the game with 16 points in an eight-minute stretch spanning the third and fourth quarters.

Junior wide receiver **Sam Shuman** started the rally with a 57-yard pass to redshirt sophomore **Ed Kiser** to set up a five-yard touchdown pass from senior quarterback **Tim Roken** to senior **Doug Ogden** that made the score 35-14 with 5:02 left in the third quarter.

The ESU defense set up the next nine points, as senior linebacker **David Pacchioni** sacked Huskies quarterback Dan Latorre for a safety with 13:30 left in the game. The Warriors scored in three plays after they got the ball back, with Roken hitting redshirt sophomore **Jeff Giglio** for 34 yards and Shuman for 14 yards before senior tailback **Joe Partridge** scored from four yards out. The extra point by senior **Greg Knauss** pulled ESU within 35-23 with 12:19 remaining.

Bloomsburg put the game away on its next possession. Latorre scrambled for 22 yards on third-and-30 to bring up a 42-yard field goal by Jon Koenig, which hit the left upright, but a false start gave the Huskies the ball back. Latorre found Jordan Weisman in the end zone to make the score 42-23 with 7:59 on the clock.

Browning returned Roken's second pass of the day for a 58-yard touchdown 1:34 into the game. Bloomsburg went the length of the field on its next possession, marching 98 yards on 16 plays, and Stefan Adams scored with 3:12 left in the opening quarter.

The Huskies extended the lead to 28-0 in the second quarter on a three-yard run by Adams and a 77-yard pass from Latorre to Kyle Ream. The Warriors got on the board with a 12-play, 51-yard drive before Derrick Price scored on a 34-yard run with 43 seconds left in the first half to give Bloomsburg its 35-7 halftime lead.

Bloomsburg ran 50 times for 221 yards and Latorre was 7-for-15 for 179 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Price (16-113, TD) carried the load for the Huskies, while Ream caught four passes for 125 yards and a first-half touchdown.

Roken was 17-for-27 for 179 yards and Partridge gained 91 yards on 15 carries and two TDs for the Warriors' offense. Redshirt sophomore **Matt Freed** made 12 stops and Pacchioni had seven tackles and 2.5 TFL for the Warriors' defense. Senior **Nick Krut**, the nation's leading punter, had punts of 57 and 55 yards and landed three of his five punts inside 10-yard line.

Oct. 18 - ESU 27, Kutztown 3

EAST STROUDSBURG - Senior tailback **Joe Partridge** led a productive offense with 97 yards rushing and the Warriors' defense limited Kutztown to a third-quarter field goal as ESU posted a 27-3 victory on Senior Day at Eiler-Martin Stadium.

The Warriors, the No. 7-ranked team in Division II's Super Regional 1, improve to 6-2 (3-2 PSAC East) and end their six-game home schedule on their new FieldTurf with a 5-1 record.

Senior wide receiver **Drew Stem** had seven punt returns for 108 yards, including a career-long 37-yard runback. Defensively, redshirt sophomore outside linebacker **Matt Freed** had nine tackles (2.0 TFL) and a sack.

ESU led 13-0 at halftime on a 14-yard touchdown pass from senior quarterback **Tim Roken** to redshirt sophomore **Jeff Giglio** in the first quarter, and two second-quarter field goals from junior kicker Greg Knauss.

The Golden Bears got on the board late in the third quarter with a 23-yard field goal by Matt Dineen. Tailback Dontay Wilson (14 carries, 109 yards) set the offense up with a 41-yard run.

ESU regained the momentum with a 72-yard march. Partridge had a 17-yard run to go over 1,500 career yards, then Roken hit redshirt freshman tailback **Russell Johnson** for 17 yards and redshirt junior wide receiver **Sam Shuman** for 46 yards to the one-yard line. Senior fullback **Jesse Reider** found the end zone two plays later to give the Warriors a 20-3 lead.

Stem's 37-yard punt return set up the final scoring drive. The Warriors kept the ball on the ground as Johnson scored from six yards out to seal the victory. Johnson had nine carries for a career-high 51 yards.

Twelve of ESU's 15 seniors were starters, six on each side of the ball, along with punter **Nick Krut**, who entered with a Division II-best 46.3-yard punting average. Krut punted five times for 41.4 yards, landing two inside the 20, and had a career-long 73-yard punt that just rolled into the end zone for a touchback in the second quarter.

Senior linebackers **Fred Rice** and **Steve Van Alstine** both had seven tackles and **David Pacchioni** made four stops. The Warriors sacked Martin three times, all for losses of 10 or more yards, with the sacks credited to Freed and defensive ends **Cody Berry** and **Matthew Faas**.

Sophomore cornerback **David Castillo**, the PSAC's leader in pass breakups, had two more to give him 11 on the season.

Kutztown gained just 204 yards, a season-low against the Warriors' defense, and was 2-of-13 on third down conversions.

Meanwhile, the offense picked up 10 of its 18 third-down opportunities and went 6-for-7 in the second half. Roken was 11-for-24 for 154 yards and Giglio and redshirt sophomore **Ed Kiser** both had three receptions.

Oct. 25 - ESU 48, C.W. Post 42

BROOKVILLE, N.Y. - Senior quarterback **Tim Roken** hit wide receiver **Doug Ogden** for a 63-yard touchdown on the final offensive play of the first half to close a 35-point second quarter that propelled East Stroudsburg University to a 48-42 win at C.W. Post on Saturday afternoon.

The Warriors (7-2, 4-2) trailed 14-3 before putting five touchdowns on the board with the wind at their backs to take a 38-21 halftime lead.

Senior tailback **Joe Partridge** had a nine-yard scoring run and Roken hooked up with redshirt sophomore wide receiver **Jeff Giglio** for a 25-yard scoring play that gave ESU a 17-14 lead.

Redshirt sophomore outside linebacker **Matt Freed** put the Warriors ahead 24-14 with a 30-yard interception return for a touchdown, part of a 10-tackle day that also included a sack and forced fumble in less than a half of action.

C.W. Post (2-7, 2-4) finally answered the Warriors' 28-point run with a 12-yard pass from Nick Georgetti to Chris Harris with 15 seconds left, but gave the Warriors just enough time. Roken threw in the direction of redshirt sophomore **Ed Kiser**, and the ball was deflected into the hands of Ogden, who caught the ball at the 25-yard line and walked into the end zone for a 17-point halftime lead.

Roken was 19-for-30 for 343 yards and two touchdowns, his third 300-yard game of the season, and Ogden hauled in eight passes for a career-high 194 yards and his 17th career touchdown.

The Pioneers scored quickly to open the second half, with Georgetti finding Paul Jennings for a 23-yard touchdown on fourth-and-two to pull within 38-28.

Jesse Reider moved to tailback when Partridge left the game with an injury and carried seven times for 34 yards on the next drive, and Knauss made a 34-yard field goal to extend the lead to 41-28.

Tailback Jason Gwaltney made it a six-point game with a five-yard run. A transfer from West Virginia, Gwaltney ran 16 times for 114 yards, including a 50-yard touchdown run.

Roken's 33-yard pass to Ogden sparked ESU's final scoring drive, with Reider going in from one yard out to give ESU a 48-35 lead with 5:23 left.

Georgetti orchestrated one more touchdown march for the Pioneers and Gwaltney took a swing pass 16 yards for a touchdown with 2:02 remaining.

Nov. 1 - ESU 45, Millersville 18

MILLERSVILLE - **Tim Roken, Matt Marshall** and **Sam Shuman** threw touchdown passes as East Stroudsburg University rolled up 572 yards of total offense in a 45-18 win at Millersville's Biemesderfer Stadium.

The Warriors' 424 passing yards included the second-longest pass play in school history, a 96-yarder from Roken to redshirt sophomore **Ed Kiser**. Roken also threw a 42-yard TD pass to senior **Doug Ogden** in the first quarter, and Shuman tossed a 16-yard pass to senior **Drew Stem** that gave ESU a 21-3 halftime lead.

Marshall hit redshirt sophomore **Jeff Giglio** for a pair of scores in the fourth quarter, from 34 and 86 yards. Marshall was 11-for-19 for 258 yards and Giglio caught five passes for 139 yards and two touchdowns.

All five ESU wide receivers were involved in scoring plays and Giglio and Kiser (two catches, 111 yards) both set career-highs for yardage. Shuman has completed both of his passes this year, for 73 yards, and also had his 100th career reception. Ogden had four catches for 84 yards.

Senior fullback **Jesse Reider** ran for 91 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries to power a rushing attack that gained nearly 150 yards for the third straight week.

The first half featured nine turnovers, five by ESU and four by Millersville, including two on one play. Marshall replaced Roken midway through the second quarter and threw two early interceptions, the second which was picked off by defensive lineman Chad Miller in Marauder territory. Marshall stripped the ball from Miller and ran 35 yards to set up Shuman's touchdown pass to Stem.

On the first play from scrimmage, Roken rolled left on a play action pass and hit Kiser streaking down the field. The school record-holder in the indoor 400m had no trouble outrunning the secondary to complete the 96-yard play, second in the record book behind Bret Comp's 99-yard pass to Ken Kopetchny at Mansfield in 1990.

Roken was 4-of-9 for 150 yards, two touchdowns and an interception while playing the first six offensive series.

Two Warriors who rank at or near the top of Division II both had productive days. Senior punter **Nick Krut**, who leads the nation with a 45.7-yard average coming into this week, averaged 43.3 yards on three punts. **Matt Freed** had eight tackles and was fifth in Division II with 11.7 tackles per game.

Head coach **Denny Douds** won his 100th career road game and improves to 217-142-3 in his 35 years at ESU.

Nov. 8 - ESU 38, SRU 21

SLIPPERY ROCK - Redshirt sophomore quarterback **Matt Marshall** threw for 365 yards and four touchdowns and East Stroudsburg University notched a 38-21 win at Slippery Rock on Saturday.

The Warriors won their final four games to finish with a 9-2 record, the seventh time they have reached nine wins under head coach Denny Douds. Douds improves to 218-142-3 in 35 seasons as ESU's head coach.

Marshall was 22-of-38 as he hooked up with redshirt sophomore **Jeff Giglio** eight times for 162 yards and a touchdown, found **Doug Ogden** four times for 96 yards and two scores, and hit redshirt junior **Sam Shuman** six times for 75 yards and a touchdown.

Shuman also threw a 41-yard pass to senior **Drew Stem** (three catches, 64 yards). **Jesse Reider** (15 carries, 57 yards, TD) started at tailback for the second straight game in place of senior **Joe Partridge** because of an injury. Partridge ran 11 times for 85 yards in the fourth quarter.

ESU gained 555 yards of total offense, 406 passing and 149 rushing, and outscored Slippery Rock 14-0 in the third quarter to break open a 17-14 game at halftime.

Junior kicker **Greg Knauss** made his 12th field goal of the season, a 22-yarder, to put ESU on the board with 8:05 left in the first quarter.

Partridge, a senior tailback from Bethlehem, had consecutive carries of 18, 13 and 11 yards on ESU's final possession, and also had a season-long 21-yard run earlier in the quarter. Partridge finishes his career with 331 carries for 1,681 yards and 17 touchdowns in two seasons as the Warriors' starting tailback.

Fifteen ESU seniors played their final regular season game - OL **David Bieber**, WR Ogden, OLB **David Pacchioni**, TB Partridge, FB Reider, LB **Fred Rice**, QB **Tim Roken**, DL **Jeff Shrive**, WR Stem and LB **Steve Van Alstine** were members of the program since they were freshmen, and OL **Ryan Ehrie**, P **Nick Krut**, DB **Lionel Mitchell**, DL **Miguel Rivera** and OL **Keith Weaver** joined the Warriors during their college careers.

Krut and **Matt Freed**, both top candidates for All-America honors, had outstanding efforts in the last game of the 2008 regular season. Krut had five punts for a 50.6-yard average, his second-highest average of this season, including a 65-yard kick. He set ESU's single-season and career punting records.

Freed had 13 tackles, his eighth game in double figures. He's tied for fifth in Division II with 11.5 tackles per game and has 126 tackles, 11.0 tackles for a loss, four sacks, four interceptions, two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble this season.
