Flags & Kudos (Student)

What is a Flag?

- Flags are alerts raised by someone in your Success Network that tell you that there is something that needs your attention.
- Flags tend to be mostly academic- such as actions you need to take within a specific course, a warning about attendance, or a tutoring recommendation.
- Flags can also be raised to indicate that you need to hand in specific paperwork or finish a process.
- Remember that receiving a flag does not mean that you are in trouble. It is simply giving you a heads up about a concern so that it can be rectified.

What Action Should I Take if I Have a Flag?

- Most flags will tell you what you need to do- such as attending class more often or handing in a document.
- o It is important that you address your flags early, so that you can get back on track in the right direction.
- o There also may be a person or specific office that you can contact for additional help.

What is a Kudos?

 A kudos is the opposite of a flag. If someone in your Success Network decides to give you a kudos, it means you have done something positive-such as performing well academically, having perfect attendance, or handing in all assignments.
